Despite the extra wear and tear of single rider carts, course superintendent Mark Louder's team have done a great job roping off areas we need to avoid. Please do what you can to avoid the habitual routes to the fairways from our cart paths. And, when you are parking by the tee boxes and greens, try to park your cart with four tires on the path. This will help the course heal more quickly from those drivers that find that difficult to do.

We just finished the Spring Kickoff, our first major tournament of the year, and there was a special kickoff this year with Cere monial Tee Shots by two of the founding members of the CLMGC, Gene Brown and Jim Lippen. Both men were given Lifetime Membership Awards in honor of their contributions to the Club over the last 50 years. Yours truly and newcomer Chris Kuminkoski were the overall champions of the SCGA 4-Ball Qualifier after shooting a net 126 for the weekend. We are looking forward to representing Canyon Lake in the next stage of the SCGA 4-Ball competition. Congratulations to all the other winners whose names and photos are in this month's Bulletin. As usual, our Head Pro Pat Kemball, along with Tournament Director Dan Rawlins and Social Director Jerry Watson, did a great job organizing the event! Special thanks to Dan's wife. Sheri, who helped at the skins sign-in table and with the snack preparations the night before.

We are entering an active tournament season with the President's Cup starting April 24th. After the initial round, you will have one week to play your next match. As part of the Point Series Player of the Year award that is designed to recognize and reward year-long participation in Major Tournaments, the President's Cup is our only tournament with a match play format. As in the past, the tournament is filled by the first 64 players that sign-up and pay, so do not delay if you are considering playing in this fun tournament. Coming on the heels of the President's Cup is the Member/Guest tournament scheduled for May 1st & 2nd. Keep in mind, ½ of the total entry fee is due by the cut-off date of April 8th, so mark your calendars accordingly!

The long-awaited repairs and replacement of the Golf Course Irrigation System was approved by the POA Board. Scheduled to begin in March 2021, the construction plan is to move through the course hole by hole, beginning with the back nine. The plan is for the project to be completed by July 2021. This is the best time of year for the project, because it is growing season so the course will heal much faster from the construction. The Club's calendar of events will go on as scheduled with minimal disruption to play. If a hole is closed, scoring for that hole will be net par for both the game you are playing and for posting to GHIN. Once a hole has reopened, you will score the hole as normal. The contractor will work on one hole at a time for about a week, before moving on to the next hole. This will provide for minimum interruption to play with 17 holes open for most of the construction time.

Ceremonial Tee Shots by Gene Brown & Jim Lippen Canyon Lake Golf Course March 13th, 2021

This year '2021' marks the 50th anniversary of the CLMGC. In celebration of this memorable event we had two of the Men's Golf Club founding members, Gene Brown and Jim Lippen, with us this day.

After honorably serving their country in the Marine Corps, and eventually migrating to California, both gentlemen purchased their Canyon Lake lots in 1969, just one year after the Corona Land Company saw its potential and began development in 1968.

Building homes in the 70's, and while running their own businesses elsewhere, Gene & Jim both moved to Canyon Lake permanently at different times in the 1980's. While enjoying diverse activities from waterskiing to hunting, RV travelling to stock car racing, their common bond was a shared love of the game of golf and the twosome have played 1000's of rounds together over the last 50 years. As members of the Men's Golf Club, both men have led our Club as President, Gene Brown in 1977 and Jim Lippen in 2001. Jim Lippen is also a past President's Cup Champion from 2002.

Since they have been here from the inception, both have many memories of the evolution of the Canyon Lake Golf Course. Always planned for 18 holes, the course opened as a 9-hole course with the back nine as we know it today. Initially, golfers teed off on what is now hole #12 and finished on hole #11. Another story goes that in Canyon Lake's earliest days, while living elsewhere, Gene would often strap his golf bag to the back of his motorcycle to make the trek to Canyon Lake to join Jim for golf and make a weekend visit out of the adventure. An additional tidbit is that the original green on hole #10 was where the flat, raised area of the fairway on the east side of the flood control channel is today. The channel was originally excavated by Jim Lippen.

Canyon Lake also used to have a pond on hole #6 where the first sand bunker is now and on hole #16 over the ridge where we have two sand bunkers now. On weekends, Gene and Jim, along with the other members of the Men's Club would collect and fill up buckets and buckets of rocks collected from all over the course. Then, they would dump them in areas generally out of play, but many were also used to create the two large mounds on hole #18 we affectionately call Dolly.

Gene Brown and Jim Lippen are indeed valued members of our community and our Club; I have only mentioned a few highlights from their lives. In honor of their leadership, their longevity, and their commitment to the improvement of our course, the 2021 Board of Directors proudly presented Lifetime Membership Awards to both Gene and Jim.

We congratulate them for lives well-lived and enjoyed watching Gene and Jim as they each hit Canyon Lake's Men's Golf Club first-ever Ceremonial Tee Shots to launch our 2021 Spring Kick-off Tournament!





Spring Member / Member results

We had 30 players participate in this years Member / Member Spring 4 Ball tournament and 44 players participated in the CLMGC / SCGA qualifier Tournament. Canyon Lake Men's Golf Club has a tradition of paying the entry fee into the actual SCGA 4 Ball tournament that is scheduled to be played at Soboba country club later this year.

There was stiff competition in all three flights of the SCGA qualifying tournament. The winner's came out of the B flight. Bruce Wallace and Chris Kuminkoski won with a two day net total of 126. They will go on to represent Canyon Lake Men's Golf Club. Bob Jacobson and Phil Coughlin were 2nd with 128 net total. They were 1st in the C Flight. Bob Jacobson shot a 33 on the front side on the final day of competition. That's a great score on a regular day, throw tournament pressure in there and that's a special round. Phil told me he was hanging on to Bob's coat tails. I've been there Phil.

The A Flight winner's were Jesse Beecher and Ryan Hambright. They won in a card off against Jon Keigwin and Kurt Mascio. Both of these teams put up solid scores of 131 net. It's nearly impossible for players of this caliber to win a net tournament where they are playing against players receiving as much as 18 max strokes with an 8 stroke differential. They played some great golf, both teams felt like they could win on Sunday morning, unfortunately for them the competition was up for the challenge.

We had 30 players and two flights in the Member Member 4- Ball tournament.

The A Flight winner's were Mike Pinto and Terry Voss with a net total of 129. A Flight 2nd place was Brad Fraser and Tom Mershon with a net total of 130. Both teams played some outstanding golf. Mike and Terry played a little more consistent shooting a 65 on Saturday and a 64 on Sunday. That's how you win tournaments! Great Job.

The B Flight winner's were Robert (Steve) Viotti and Ted Russelle with a Net total score of 123! 2nd place went to Eric Schrader and Sam Theodora with a Net total of 125. These two teams played a different golf course than I did. Outstanding golf. I'm very happy to see Steve Viotti in the winner's circle. He is a very nice man and he works hard at his game.

Team play 2021

Canyon Lake is a proud participant in the SCGA annual Team Play tournament. We are supporting teams in the Thursday and Saturday divisions. The format is Match Play. There are eight two man teams. Points are awarded for each individual match and a team match for each grouping. A total of 48 points is available per match. Early rounds are played with other courses in a general geographic area with each team playing both home and away. Points are accumulated across all matches played and the top teams from each grouping move on to the playoffs.

All team members are able to play for both Thursday and Saturday teams. General information for both teams is as follows:

The Thursday team is 2-1 this year. We beat Canyon Crest 31-17, and Bear Creek 30-18. We lost to Canyon Crest 40-8 at Canyon Crest. We still have to play at Bear Creek and Sun Lakes the next two weeks, and we finish with a home match with Sun Lakes on the first of April. The points are as follows: Canyon Crest 82, Canyon Lake 70, Bear Creek 58, and Sun Lakes 30. (more to come, hope to have info through march 25) Today we played Bear Creek at their place. It was cold and windy, very tough scoring conditions. That being said, we took most of our matches to at least the 16th hole and 4 matches we lost on 18. The final score was 36-12 and we are now 2 & 2 for the season. We have our last away match against Sun Lakes and we then finish at home on the 8th. Rick Halsey.

Saturday Team is 0-3. We lost to Tijeras Creek at home 20-28. (They went to the semi-finals last year). We also lost to Bear Creek at Bear Creek 20-28. # JOURNEY THROUGH THE RULES OF GOLF By Pat Kemball

Next on our journey through the rules are <u>Loose Impediments and Movable Obstructions</u>.

Loose impediments and movable obstructions are two categories of items that the Rules do not consider part of the challenge of playing the game, and therefore they can be moved. Loose impediments are unattached natural objects such as sticks, leaves, twigs, and blades of grass so long as they are not fixed or growing, solidly embedded in the ground, or sticking to the ball. Movable obstructions are artificial objects that can be moved with reasonable effort such as a water bottle, scorecard, broken tee, trash can, bench, etc.

Loose impediments and movable obstructions can be moved anywhere on the golf course, including in bunkers and penalty areas, even when your ball also lies in the bunker or penalty area. If your ball moves when moving a movable obstruction, there is no penalty and you simply replace the ball. However, you will need to be careful when moving loose impediments because if that causes your ball to move, you will get a one-stroke penalty and must replace your ball. The only time a penalty does not apply is if you ball lay on the putting green when moving a loose impediment caused it to move.

Here are some of the most frequently asked questions from our members:

#### May I remove stones in bunkers?

Yes. Stones are loose impediments and you may remove any loose impediments that are in a bunker, even when your ball came to rest there (see Rule 12.2a). But, you'll want to be careful that your ball does not move if you move a loose impediment or you will get on penalty stroke, and must replace you ball.

### May I remove a loose natural object (loose impediment) in a bunker? What a bout an artificial object?

A loose natural object is a loose impediment and may be removed anywhere on the golf course (see Rule 12.2a). But, be careful that your ball does not move when removing a loose impediment as you will get one penalty stroke and you must replace your ball. An artificial object is an obstruction. If it's movable, it may be moved anywhere on the course, including in bunkers and penalty areas.

#### May I remove loose natural objects in a penalty area?

A loose natural object is a loose impediment and may be removed anywhere on the golf course. But, you'll want to be careful that your ball does not move if you move a loose impediment or you will get one penalty stroke and have to replace your ball.

#### May I remove sand and /or loose soil on the putting green?

Yes. Sand and loose soil may be removed on the putting green (see Rule 13.1c(1)). But, if you remove sand or loose soil anywhere else on the course, you may not improve the conditions affecting your next stroke (this means to improve your lie, area of intended stance, area of intended swing or line of play) when doing so.

#### **Definitions:**

#### Loose Impediment

Any unattached natural object such as:

- Stones, loose grass, leaves, branches and sticks,
- Dead animals and animal waste,
- Worms, insects and similar animals that can be removed easily, and the mounds or webs they build (such as worm casts and ant hills), and
- Clumps of compacted soil (including aeration plugs).

#### Such natural objects are not loose if they are:

- Attached or growing,
- Solidly embedded in the ground (that is, cannot be picked out easily), or
- Sticking to the ball.

#### Special cases:

- Sand and Loose Soil are not loose impediments,
- Snow and Natural Ice (other than frost) are either loose impediments or, when on the ground, temporary water, at the player's option.
- Spider Webs are loose impediments even though they are attached to another object.

#### Obstruction:

Any artificial object except for integral objects and boundary objects.

Examples of obstructions:

- Artificially surfaced roads and paths, including their artificial borders.
- Buildings and rain shelters.
- Sprinkler heads, drains and irrigation or control boxes.
- Stakes, wall, railings and fences (but not when they are boundary objects that define or show the boundary edge of the course).
- Golf carts, mowers, cars, and other vehicles.
- Waste containers, signposts and benches.
- Player equipment, flagsticks and rakes.

An obstruction is either a movable obstruction of an immovable obstruction. If part of an immovable obstruction (such as a gate or door or part of an attached cable) meets the definition of movable obstruction, that part is treated as a movable obstruction.

#### Movable Obstruction:

An obstruction that can be moved with reasonable effort and without damaging the obstruction or the course.

If part of an immovable obstruction or integral object (such as a gate or door or part of and attached cable) meets these two standards, that part is treated as a movable obstruction. But, this does not apply if the movable part of an immovable obstruction or integral object is not meant to be moved (such as a loose stone that is part of a stone wall).

Add 12 to the player's Handicap Index at the start date. This value is A. Add 12 to the player's Handicap Index at the end date. This value is B.

Divide value A by value B, calculating to three decimal places. This is the improvement factor. The player with the highest improvement factor should receive the most improved player award. Example:

#### **IMPORTANT NOTICE**

#### Irrigation Replacement Project

As you may already know, the long-awaited repairs/replacement of the Golf Course Irrigation System was approved by the POA Board. It is scheduled to begin in early March 2021. The construction plan is to move through the golf course hole by hole beginning with the back nine. We anticipate the project to be completed in approximately 4 months or early July 2021. This is the best time of year for the project, because it is growing season for our turf and our fairways and roughs will heal much faster from the construction.

Benefits for the course are many, (sprinkler coverage will be uniform, no sprinklers mysteriously running all night, less wet areas, a new Weather Station, two new Pump Stations, significant water savings, and along with that comes dollar savings for the POA.)

Your Club's calendar of events will go on as scheduled with minimal disruption to play. If a hole is closed, scoring for that hole will be (net par for both the game you are playing and for posting to GHIN). Once a hole has reopened, you will score the hole as normal.

We will undoubtedly be faced with some (Abnormal Ground Conditions). We will be implementing a local rule for the duration of the construction cycle.

#### Temporary Local Rule:


Normally Ground Under Repair will be marked with white lines, however during the irrigation construction we will not be able to keep up with marking all the areas affected by the construction. Therefore we will be granting <u>free swing and stance relief</u> from all damages related to the construction. This will include tire tracks, holes made by construction, seams in sod, and items piled for removal.
