

A MESSAGE FROM YOUR CLUB HISTORIAN

It's Canyon Lake Men's Golf Club Championship time - AGAIN!

June 4,5 & 6, 2021 are the dates of the 49th Canyon Lake Men's Golf Club Championship. The first Club Championship was held in 1972 and was called the President's Cup – Club Championship. The first Canyon Lake Club Champion was Harvey Malcomson, one of the Charter Members of the Club. There's no history as to what he shot or other details on the tournament.

There is some interesting historical information on tournaments over the years. Thirty-five (35) of the Club Championships have been won by a select group of seven (7) multi-time winners. Leading the field with nine (9) wins each are Bert Nafziger (1973,74,75, 77, 78,79, 80, 82 and 83) and Brandon Mojarro (2010, 11, 12, 14, 15, 16, 17, 18 and 19). You might call these "bookend dynasties" as they occurred in the first eleven (11) and last eleven (11) club championships.

In between the above champions there were five (5) other multiple winners: Marcus Schonabaum - 6 times, 1994, 2002, 05, 06, 07 and 08); John McCaffrey – 4 times, 1984, 86, 89 and 93; Robert Funk – 3 times, 1997, 99 and 2000; and two wins each for Mark Richey in 1987 and 1988 and Ian Nelson in 2003 and 2004. Ian is also the youngest club champion winning his first championship at age 20 and again the following year.

Perhaps the most memorable winner is Jerry Erickson who in 1998 hit his second shot on number 18, a 6 iron, into the hole for an Albatross (double eagle) to win the tournament. A plaque on the 18 tee commemorates this achievement.

There are currently four (4) members of the Men's Golf Club that are former Club Champions: Brandon Mojarro, Marcus Schonabaum, Robert Funk, Greg Leathley – 1991, plus current Champion, Ryan Hambright.

Who will be the next to be called - Club Champion? We'll know soon!

Canyon Lake Men's Golf Club Average Age!

On and off over the years, surveys have been conducted to determine the average age of our golf club. The first time this was done was in **1987** when our membership was 283, about 40 more members than it is currently. The average age was **60.2** years. Thirty-four years later, in **2021** the average age of our members had matured to **67.25** years. Ten years ago, in **2011**, we had 286 members whose average age was **67.3** years, $5/100^{th}$'s of a year older than a decade later (it looks like we're getting younger, even if we don't feel it). But, if you go back twenty years, in **2001** with 451 members, the average age was **64.3** years and you start feeling older. We currently have two members that are our most senior at 95 years old during 2021: Gene Brown and Tom Steinle, both of whom can be seen weekly on the golf course. Our youngest member is Junior Member Nixon Lauritzen who turned 15 in April.

Trivia!

As a follow-up to our two longest members, 50 years each, Gene Brown and Jim Lippen, our third longest continuous member, with 39 years is Phil Coughlin.

## **Red Shirt Friday**



A subset of the Men's Club play most Fridays starting between 7AM and 8AM depending on the time of year. They play a combination of closest to the pin on par three holes, net skins based on half pops, and a partner's blind draw. The size of the group varies from 20 to 30 players per week. You will see the participant wearing red shirts. The red shirts are an outward sign of support for our military. This is a national movement that has been around for many years to recognize and support our military.

This history has been assembled from multiple sources.

It's a tiny act that means much more than people seem to realize. On Fridays, civilians back home wear an article of red clothing — a shirt, a tie, anything — as a reminder to all to *Remember Everyone Deployed*. These Fridays became known as R.E.D. Friday.

Today, you'll see this tradition honored by most military family members, and supporters of the troops, but it actually got its start about a dozen years ago. Let's talk about how this patriotic way of showing your support for the troops that are in harm's way got started and why it's an important movement.

There are actually two competing origin stories of this unofficial trend. The first says it all began in 2005 with a specific <u>email</u> that recipients were supposed to forward to others.

That email had a very polite snippet in it for a good cause:

If every one of our members shares this with other acquaintances, fellow workers, friends, and neighbors, I guarantee that it will not be long before the USA will be covered in RED — and make our troops know there are many people thinking of their well-being. You will feel better all day Friday when you wear RED!

Now, there's no telling if this chain email tactic is really what got people wearing red on Fridays, but if it was, it has to be one of the only times that people actually read one of those chain emails.

The tradition may not entirely be an American concept, but the sentiment is the same. Our brothers to the North still have troops in harm's way, too.

In <u>March, 2006</u>, another more-tangible movement began in Canada that implored subscribers to wear red to support the troops who are deployed. Now, there's no telling if this movement got its start from the previously-mentioned email chain, but they *do* credit it as being an "American initiative."

Military spouses Lisa Miller and Karen Boier organized an event and rallied many of their fellow Canadians to show up wearing red. While the "RED" is the color that fits the acronym, it also happens to work perfectly with the Canadian flag. These events gathered steam and grew continuously until, eventually, its reach extended all the way up to the Canadian Prime Minister, Stephen Harper. On <u>Sept 23rd, 2006</u>, Harper led a rally of thousands in a show of solidarity for the Canadian soldiers deployed to Afghanistan as part of the Global War on Terrorism.

RED Fridays seem to wax and wane in terms of popularity among civilians, but the core of the movement is important: to Remember Everyone Deployed. The Global War on Terrorism is now officially older than troops eligible to enlist and serve in that same war — it's important to remember that we've *still* got men and women out there fighting for us. It's not hard to show your support for the troops: Simply pick something red from your wardrobe and be ready to wear it on Friday, volunteer your time organizing care packages for troops who still need essential items, or write to a deployed troop. I know from personal experience that every letter I received was a boost to morale that I happily honored with a reply. Simple gestures go a long way.

Remember Everyone Deployed.

#### A Journey through the Rules of Golf....

Continuing in Section Two of our journey, *Taking Relief*, we will be discussing the topic of Loose Impediments and Movable Obstructions.

Loose impediments and movable obstructions are two categories of items that the Rules do not consider part of the challenge of playing the game, and therefore they can be moved. Loose impediments are unattached natural objects such as sticks, leaves, twigs, and blades of grass so long as the are not fixed or growing, solidly embedded in the ground, or sticking to the ball. Movable obstructions are artificial objects that can be moved with reasonable effort such as water bottle, scorecard, broken tee, trash can, bench, etc.

Loose impediments and movable obstructions can be moved any where on the golf course, including in bunkers and penalty areas, even when your ball also lies in the bunker or penalty area. If your ball moves when moving a movable obstruction, there is no penalty and you simply replace the ball. However, you will need to be careful when moving loose impediments because if that causes your ball to move, you will get a one-stroke penalty and must replace your ball. The only time a penalty does not apply is if your ball lay on the putting green when moving a loose impediment caused it to move.

Here are some frequently asked questions from our members:

#### Can I remove stones in bunkers?

Yes, Stones are loose impediments and you may remove any loose impediments that are in a bunker, even when your ball came to rest there (see Rule 12.2a). But, you'll want to be careful that your ball does not move if you move a loose impediment or you will get a one-stroke penalty, and must t replace your ball.

## Can I remove a loose natural object, like a leaf (loose impediment) in a bunker? What about an artificial object, like a water bottle?

A loose natural object is a loose impediment and may be removed anywhere on the golf course (se Rule 12.2a). But, be careful, if your ball moves you will get a one-stroke penalty and must replace your ball. An artificial object is an obstruction. If it's movable, it may be moved anywhere on the golf course, including in bunkers and penalty areas.

#### Can I remove loose natural objects in a penalty area?

A loose natural object is a loose impediment and my be removed anywhere on the golf course. (This is one of the many changes that occurred in 2019) Be careful when moving loose impediments because if your ball moves you will get a one-stroke penalty and must replace your ball.

#### Can I remove sand and/or loose soil on the putting green?

Yes, Sand and loose soil may be removed on the putting green (see Rule 13.1c(1)). But, if you remove sand or loose soil anywhere else on the golf course, you may not improve the conditions affecting your next stroke (this means to improve your lie, area of intended stance, area of intended swing or line of play) when doing so.

Here are some Definitions that pertain to this section::

#### Loose Impediment:

Any unattached natural object such as:

- Stones, loose grass, leaves, branches and sticks
- · Dead animals and animal waste
- Worms, insects and similar animals that can be removed easily, and the sounds or webs that build (such as worm casts and ant hills), and

Clumps of compacted soil (including aeration plugs).

#### Such natural objects are not loose impediments if they are:

- Attached or growing
- · Solidly imbedded in the ground (that is, cannot be picked out easily), or
- Sticking to the ball

#### Special cases:

- Sand and Loose Soil are not loose impediments.
- Dew, Frost and Water are not loose impediments.
- Snow and Natural Ice (other than frost), are either loose impediments or, when on the ground, temporary water, at the player's option.
- · Spider Webs are loose impediments even though they are attached to another object.

#### Obstruction:

Any artificial object except for integral objects and boundary objects.

#### Examples of obstructions:

- Artificially surfaced roads and paths, including their artificial borders.
- · Buildings and rain shelters.
- Sprinkler heads, drains and irrigation control boxes.
- Stakes, walls, railings and fences (but not when they are boundary objects that define or show the boundary edge of the course).
- · Golf carts, mowers, cars and other vehicles.
- · Waste containers, signposts and benches.
- · Player equipment, flagsticks and rakes.

An obstruction is either movable or immovable. If part of and immovable obstruction (such as a gate or door or part of an attached cable) meets the definition of movable obstruction, that part is treated as a movable obstruction.

#### Movable Obstruction:

An obstruction that can be moved with reasonable effort and without damaging the obstruction or the course.

If any part of an immovable obstruction or integral object (such as a gate door or part of an attached cable) meets these two standards, that part is treated as a movable obstruction. But this does not apply if the movable part of an immovable obstruction or integral object is not meant to be moved (such as a loose stone that is part of a stone wall). Even when an obstruction is lovable, the Committee may define it to be an immovable obstruction.

#### Instructions for determining the Most Improved Golfer

Add 12 to the player's Handicap Index at the start date. This value is A. Add 12 to the player's Handicap Index at the end date. This value is B.

Divide value A by value B, calculating to three decimal places. This is the improvement factor. The player with the highest improvement factor should receive the most improved player award.

Example:

Starting Handicap Index: 24.3 | Ending Handicap Index: 16.2

Value A: 24.3 + 12 = 36.3 | Value B: 16.2 + 12 = 28.2

A / B: 36.3 / 28.2 = 1.128 Improvement factor: 1.128



#### **UPCOMING:**


