A good rule of thumb is to leave any bunker you are in, better than you found it. If we all do our part, it will make for a better bunker experience for everyone. I also anticipate we will continue to be able to take relief from conditions and materials related to the irrigation project throughout the end of July. Bear in mind that efforts to regenerate turf damaged by the irrigation project, coupled with the extremely high heat of late, means excessive watering is possible in some areas. Keep your eyes on the region in front of you and try to avoid driving through obvious areas of soggy turf. It will help our course recover faster and you won't have to clean the mud off your golf cart as often!

On another note, please remember that the green plastic baskets at the driving range are not to be removed from the range. If anyone has previously taken a basket home with unused driving range balls in anticipation of hitting them later, please return the baskets immediately, as baskets available to golfers on the range is at an embarrassing low level. I know Pat Kemball will appreciate it, as will the

numerous golfers on the range each day.

At our June Board meeting we approved Mike Pinto to assume the duties of Director and he has been assigned Membership & Rules Director. This will allow John Reed to focus his duties as Handicap Chair. A MESSAGE FROM YOUR CLUB HISTORIAN

What was happening 35 years ago?

The Men's Golf Club President's mid-year 1986 Bulletin Message:

"As we pass the halfway mark in your Board's term of office, it might be well to look back at accomplishments thus far and then look ahead at happenings still to come.

Continued growth in the club's membership deserves special mention as the membership count went over the 300 mark.

The first half of the year includes the agonizing wait for the old clubhouse to disappear and the work on the new building to actually commence. A once in a lifetime experience was the move to the temporary facilities, seeing individuals and groups adjust to the crowding and inconvenience and acceptance of the fact that it is all temporary and relief from it all is taking place just a few hundred feet away.

Memorable indeed during this first half were the highly successful major tournaments including the Member-Guest, the Hobo and the currently in progress Club Championship.

Not to be forgotten was the determined, unrelenting and ultimately successful fight for a cause that was believed to be right, the crusade against a 16% increase in annual green fees. The combined efforts of the golfing sector in their letters, petitions and presentations to the P.O.A. Board led to the proposed 16% increase being scaled back to 8%.

An outstanding event, to say the least, was the auctioning of the old tee markers to nostalgia minded members which raised the astonishing sum of \$1, 385.00 towards the landscaping of the new clubhouse." Bob Caveney, President

Instructions for determining the Most Improved Golfer

Add 12 to the player's Handicap Index at the start date. This value is A. Add 12 to the player's Handicap Index at the end date. This value is B.

Divide value A by value B, calculating to three decimal places. This is the improvement factor. The player with the highest improvement factor should receive the most improved player award.

Example:

Starting Handicap Index: 24.3 | Ending Handicap Index: 16.2 Value A: 24.3 + 12 = 36.3 | Value B: 16.2 + 12 = 28.2

A / B: 36.3 / 28.2 = 1.128 Improvement factor: 1.128

A Journey through the Rules of Golf....

Continuing in Section Two of our journey, *Taking Relief*, we will be discussing the topic of Out of Bounds/Lost Ball/Provisional Ball.

If you hit your ball out of bounds or lose it (you have three minutes to search for your ball before it becomes lost), your only option is to go back to the spot of your previous stroke to play under stroke and distance. The only exceptions to this are if your ball is lost in a penalty area (when you can use any of the penalty area relief options) or lost in an abnormal ground condition or in an obstruction.

A final exception is when a new Local Rule which provides an alternative to stroke and distance relief is in effect. This Local Rule is recommended for casual play and not for competitions involving highly-skilled players. If it is in effect, for two penalty strokes, you can estimate the spot where your ball is lost or went out of bounds and then find the nearest fairway edge that is not nearer the hole than the estimated spot. You can drop a ball in the fairway within two club-lengths of that fairway edge point, or anywhere between there and the estimated spot where your ball is lost or went out of bounds.

If you think that your ball might be out of bounds or that you might not find it, you can play a provisional ball to save time. You must announce that you are playing a provisional ball before doing so. If you are then unable to find your original ball, or you find it out of bounds, your provisional ball is your ball in play under stroke and distance, and you don't have to take the time to walk all the way back to the spot of our previous stroke.

Here are some of the frequently asked questions from our members:

I can't find my ball after searching for three minutes - what are my options? If you can't find your ball within three minutes, it is lost. Because it is lost, you must return to the spot of your previous stroke and play another ball from there for one penalty stroke (see Rule 18.2b).

I have interference from an out of bounds fence, stake or wall - what are my options? You do not get relief from objects that define or mark the course boundary. You may not move objects marking course boundaries or take free relief from them like you would from other artificial objects, like a cart path, a building, or a stake marking a penalty area. Your options are to play your ball as it lies, proceed under penalty of stroke and distance by playing again from the sport of your last stroke (see Rule 18.1), or decide your ball is unplayable (see Rule 19.1).

May I remove and out of bounds stake?

No, objects marking the course boundaries may not be moved. If you do move one of these objects before you play and doing so makes your next stroke easier in any way, you must put it back before you make a stroke. If you don't, you will lose the hole in match play or get two penalty strokes in stroke play (se Rule 8.1a and Rule 8.1c).

I think my ball is stuck in the ground, but I can't find it - how do I proceed?

If you can't find you ball within three minutes, it is lost. Because it is lost, you must return to the spot of your previous stroke and play another ball for one penalty stroke (see Rule 18.2b).

Here are some definitions that pertain to this section:

Lost:

The status of a ball that is not found in three minutes after the player or his or her caddie (or the player's partner or partner's caddie) begins to search for it.

If the search begins and is then temporarily interrupted for a good radeon (such as when the player stops searching when play is suspended or needs to stand aside to wait for another player to play) or when the player has mistakenly identified a wrong ball:

- · The time between the interruption and when the search resumes does to count, and
- The time allowed for search is three minutes in total, counting the search time both before the interruption and after the search resumes.

Out of Bounds:

All areas outside the boundary edge of the course as defined by the committee. All areas inside that edge are in bounds.

The boundary edge of the course extends both up above the ground and down below the around:

- This means that all ground and anything else (such as any natural or artificial object) inside the boundary edge is in bounds, whether on, above or below the surface of the ground.
- If an object is both inside and outside the boundary edge (such as steps attached to a
 boundary fence, or a tree rooted outside the edge with branches extending inside the edge
 or vice versa), only the part of the object that is outside the edge is out of bounds.

The boundary edge should be defined by boundary objects or lines:

 Boundary objects: When defined by stakes or a fence, the boundary edge is defined by the line between the course-side points of the stakes or fence posts at ground level (excluding angled supports), and those stakes or fence posts are out of bounds.

When defined by other objects such as a wall or when the Committee wishes to treat a boundary fence in a different way, the Committee should define the boundary edge.

• Lines: When defined by a painted line on the ground, the boundary edge is the course-side edge of the line, and the line itself is out of bounds.

When a line on the ground defines the boundary edge, stakes may be used to show where the boundary edge is, but they have no other meaning.

Boundary stakes or lines should be white.

Provisional Ball:

Another ball played in case the ball just played by the payer may be:

- · Out of bounds, or
- Lost outside a penalty area.

A provisional ball is not the player's ball in play, unless it becomes the ball in play under Rule 18.3c.

For further knowledge of this section please read Rule 18 Stroke-and-Distance Relief; Ball Lost or Out of Bounds; Provisional Ball.



Congratulations to this year's Presidents Cup winner Tom Faia who beat Mark Wagoner on the second extra hole. What a great finish. The Presidents Cup is one of the few tournaments that use the match play format. This year's field started with 64 players and matches extended for nearly seven weeks as the winners advanced through the ladder.

First round losers were put in a consolation bracket and played single elimination toward the Vice Presidents Cup. Andrew Quinn beat Alan Horst 5 and 4 for the title.

Match play is a scoring system for golf in which a player, or team, earns a point for each hole in which they have bested their opponents; as opposed to stroke play, in which the total number of strokes is counted over one or more rounds of 18 holes. In match play the winner is the player, or team, with the most points at the end of play. If players are tied at the end of 18 holes, then the first player to win a hole wins the match.


If you are interested in more competition using the match play format, keep an eye out for the Team Play season or consider participating in the Temecula Valley Golf League (TGVL)
