Golf Course Lake Restoration Update

The lake restoration project on holes 12, 13 & 14 has been delayed due to the December rain. When the project resumes, we will see the removal of the existing rock waterfall, a natural boulder shoreline behind the 13th green, expansion of the 14th hole tee area and replacement of the bridge from the 13th green to the 14 tee with an earthen walkway. Instead of a railroad tie border around the lake, the grass will taper down to the water's edge around a majority of the lake.

One of the major reasons behind the lake restoration project is water savings. The project will include a "lake liner" that will save up to 20,000 gallons of water from leaking daily with a water savings of \$40-50,000 annually to the community. The lake is approaching 50 years old and has outlived its useful life. The restoration will replace the failing lake with a full size lake to maintain the historic and aesthetic value of the lake to the golf course and the community.

The POA is working with the contractor to reestablish a construction schedule compatible with the contractor's scheduled commitments. Hopefully that will occur during the first quarter of the year.

For now, we still have a lake surrounding the 13th green!

Answer True or False to the following questions

Answers on page 13

1. Any area of sand on the course, whether or not prepared, is considered to be a bunker.
2. In match play, a player, whose ball lies in a bunker, casually leans on his club while waiting for his opponent to play gets a one stroke penalty for touching the sand.
3. A ball is lost if, after searching for it for one minute, the player declares it to be lost.
4. A player's ball in the rough lies in the loose material caused by a rabbit digging a hole. The player is entitled to free relief
5. A ball is considered outside the teeing area when any part of it lies outside the teeing area.
6. A player's ball is found by another player 2 minutes 50 seconds after they began searching for the ball. It takes the player 30 seconds to get to his ball and identify it. Since the ball was identified after the three minute search time had finished, the ball is considered lost
7. If a player makes his first stroke in a round on a non-conforming tee, he is disqualified.
8. If it is 75% certain that a ball that has not been found is in a penalty area, the player may take back-on-on-the-line relief from the penalty area under penalty of one stroke.
9. Loose impediments are part of the lie of the ball.
10. When the edge of ground under repair (GUR) is defined by a line on the ground, the line itself is in the ground under repair.
11. A boundary stake is an obstruction



Hole #17 Gets Iconic Lighthouse Reproduction!

The CLAPPS (Canyon Lake Association of Past Presidents of the Men's Golf Club) continue their efforts to beautify and improve our golf course with a \$7,000 facelift behind hole #17. Their latest project brought life to a barren and desolated hill behind the green. Hole #17 is our iconic par 3 that plays 180 yards from the back tees and is well known for its 100 foot drop from tee to green.

The CLAPPS have raised nearly \$100,000 in recent years with their Beautification Tournament that is held annually in the spring. Some of the golf course improvements they are responsible for include; 13 new concrete benches, expanded practice putting green, concrete pad and artificial turf at the driving range, 20 bronze tee signs at each hole and the beautiful 11' tall street clock that was installed in 2018. All of these projects were done in concert with the Tuesday Work Group (TWG) who has graciously provided the volunteer man power needed for these improvements. The TWG was especially instrumental in the hole #17 project by clearing all the growth and rocks from the 2000 square foot hillside and helping to install 20 cubic yards of Decomposed Granite better known as DG.

The project was a recommendation from one of the participants in the tournament who submitted a request to improve the area behind #17 green. The idea was unanimously approved by the CLAPPS and authorization was given by the POA to move forward. In addition to cleaning and planting the hillside the idea for a concrete lighthouse to match the community logo was raised and researched. Project coordinator Joe Kamashian approached Eric Kazakoff, POA General Manager, with the idea of a concrete lighthouse behind the green and he was on board with the plan. Joe was able to work with David Cardoza in the POA graphic department who did a great job creating a workable design. The design was eventually converted to a life size banner approximately 8' wide and 18' tall. The banner was helpful to allow for positioning of the lighthouse on the hill for optimum viewing and it was used by the concrete crew to set the forms in the exact shape of the lighthouse.

Color was added to the concrete with concrete etching, a process that gives the color a longer life with much less maintenance. Sal Medina in the POA Operations Department was helpful with the selection and design of the plants and the drip irrigation system.

The final touches were done by the TWG with the placement of some boulders and the installation of 20 cubic yards of DG. The TWG did an amazing job throughout the project thanks to the leadership of Don Norris and Dave Nickel

This was clearly a joint effort of the TWG, the POA and the CLAPPS along with the private contractors and vendors who helped beautify our golf course and made possible by the generous support of those who participated in or donated to the Beautification Tournament.


