If you are seeing double that's because Marv Tweedy shot two hole-in-ones within a week's time on the same hole in the Men's Club Wednesday Game.


The first one came on July 3rd on the 120 yard 15th hole when he hit his 5 hybrid club from the blue tees. The excitement started when the neighbors saw the ball go in the hole from their balcony. Playing with Marv in his foursome were his regular playing partners Dennis Franks, Eddie Doidge and Jim Musser.

The second one came just a week later on July 10th, just 4 days before his 88th birthday. Same hole, same club, same shot, same foursome and same results. Even the neighbors came out to see the excitement when the ball went in the hole.



Marv played only one round of golf between his exciting Wednesday rounds which means he played exactly 36 holes between the hole-in-one shots. According to Golf Digest the odds for an amateur golfer of getting a hole-in-one are 12,500 to 1. I can only imagine the odds for two hole-in-ones in 36 holes on the same hole must be in the millions.

Marv, who has been a Men's Club member since 1996, commented that this was his second and third hole-in-ones. His first came over 20 years ago on the same hole

Getting to Know Bryan Carlson, PGA by Ted Horton, CLMGC Secretary

Bryan was born and raised in South East Iowa and worked at the local golf course as a range attendant and bag boy since he was thirteen. At the young age of 17, high school just behind him, Bryan packed up the car and moved to California to pursue a career as a Golf Professional. He earned an Associate of Arts in Business Degree from the Professional Golfers Career College in Temecula, CA where he specialized in Professional Golf Management including Golf Shop Operations, Country Club Management, Tournament Operations and Business & Clinic Planning and Golf Instruction. Furthering his education, he attended Professional Golfers Association of America classes and passed PGA Checkpoints 1, 2 & 3 in Port St. Lucie, Florida. Level 1, 2 & 3 consists of 400 hours of bookwork, work experience and teachings in numerous categories ranging from golf instruction to budget analysis and forecast.

Bryan and his wife Ashley have twin 5-year old daughters lovingly named "HAC" and "PAC" - Harper Alexis Carlson and Presley Ann Carlson. When time permits, Bryan and Ashley love to snowboard.

Bryan worked as an Assistant Golf Professional at East Valley Golf Club, The Country Club at Soboba Springs and The Champions Club at the Retreat before becoming 1st Assistant Golf Professional at Canyon Lake Country Club under the tutelage of Pat Kemball in March of 2017. The SCPGA Inland Empire Chapter recognized Bryan as its "Assistant Professional of the Year" in 2014.

Bryan has a passion for teaching. He noted "I enjoy watching every student expand their knowledge and abilities in golf but my heart is working with kids". The Canyon Lake Country Club Junior Academy was started by Bryan with Pat's guidance. Initiated as a 4-week program the instruction migrated into the current 12 week program that focuses on three month-long levels of competency – Beginner, Intermediate and Advanced.

The Beginner level is very basic, game based and designed to be "fun-oriented". The Intermediate level instruction is less game-focused and more "golf-focused". Students learn details such as reading the greens, golf etiquette and course care (divot replacement, ball mark repair, bunker raking, etc.). In the Advanced level instruction, the students can play the game, they work on putting and chipping, game strategy, rules & penalties, shot execution (high, low, slice, hook) and scoring. The students are required to play at least 9 holes of golf each month and Bryan encourages them to enter local tournaments. He is proud that 3 of his students achieved a 2nd place win in their age group at the recent Valley Junior Golf Association Tournament here at Canyon Lake.

I couldn't help but wonder how the CLCC Golf Clubs could help Bryan grow the Junior programs. When I asked Bryan for suggestions he was very hesitant, but noted "I could use all the help CLCC golfers are willing to give". While the golf community strongly supports the Junior Golf Camp, as we all just witnessed, there is very little support for Bryan's golf academy. Surprisingly, only 3 students of the 190 participants in the recent golf camp continued into the academy. I'd like to challenge the 4 Golf Clubs to give some thought to how we could help to grow this program possibly by: contributing funds for CLCC Junior Memberships, tournament entry fees, additional private lessons, purchase of equipment, marketing of the program, additional teaching equipment and personnel to assist Bryan. Bryan admitted that he has spent over \$5,000 of his own money to advance the program. Let's help – if we can attract Junior Golfer's, the parents won't be far behind.

Bryan is focused on teaching golf as his career direction. He is fascinated with the modern advances in "Mach 3 Speed Training" that studies motor patterns that enhance the golf swing. Teaching a youngster to love the game of golf is his greatest achievement and he wishes more of his students would participate in local junior competition to provide a barometer to measure their abilities and ultimately verify Bryan's teaching skills.

We are fortunate to have an instructor of Bryan's capability to teach the game of golf to our children. Thanks Bryan. Good luck!

The game they play is called a Chapman. It is a nine hole event played in the early evening once a month in the summer months of May, June, July and August. Couples compete for prize money and bragging rights at the awards dinner that is held at Roadrunner Park on the lake. Both players of a team will tee off then they hit their partner's ball for the second shot. They must select one ball and continue with alternate shots until the ball is holed. Each team will get a handicap based on 60% of the lower handicap player and 40% of the higher handicap player and be assigned to one of three flights. Bruce says they typically pay three places in each of the three flights and have a special cash award to the couple with the highest

score.

Before Bruce and Norma stepped up to run the game there was a standing policy that the winners each month were responsible to run the event in the next month. Everyone knew it took so much work to organize the event that they wouldn't want to win first place. Second place was good enough.



Here is a list of what Bruce and Norma do each month for a Twilight event. Post a signup sheet and promote the event, coordinate with Skip Thomas Catering for the meal, Figure the handicaps, build the scorecards, collect the money, reserve Roadrunner Park, provide chips and salsa for about 40 to 50 players, do all the scoring and pass out the prize money. We are all grateful for what they do organizing the event each month.

The meals are prepared by Skip Thomas Catering in Hemet and have been delivered by Jamie for over 25 years to events throughout Canyon Lake. Jamie always comes with a smile and a wonderful dessert.

There is only one more Twilight Golf event this year. It is scheduled for Friday evening August 9th. The cost is \$35 per couple and includes dinner but does not include golf fees. If you are interested you need to sign up in the pro shop and pay in cash only or contact Bruce or Norma at 951-244-8753 for more information.



Rules for Men's Club Bulletin

1. Obstructions in Drought Tolerant Areas

Rule 16.1 - Abnormal Course Conditions (Including Immovable Obstructions)

This rule covers free relief that is allowed from interference by animal holes, ground under repair, immovable obstructions or temporary water.

These are collectively called abnormal course conditions, but each has a separate definition.

Rule 16.1a - When Relief is Allowed

(1) Meaning of Interference by Abnormal Course Condition

Interference exists when any one of these is true:

-The player's ball touches or is in or on an abnormal course condition,

-An abnormal course condition physically interferes with the player's area of intended swing, or

-Only when the ball is on the putting green, an abnormal course condition on or off the putting green intervenes on the line of play.

If the abnormal course condition is close enough to **distract** the player but does **not** meet any of these requirements, there is **no interference** under this rule.

Examples:



In the first photo the player when attempting to play the ball to the green clearly has interference from the split rail fence, so he will be entitled to free relief. The second photo shows the player after taking complete relief.



In this example the player would be entitled to free relief from the sprinkler head, as the player has a clear shot to advance the ball to the hole, but would be interfered by the obstruction.

(2) Relief Allowed Anywhere on Course Except When Ball Is in Penalty Area

Relief from interference by an abnormal course condition is allowed under Rule 16.1 only when both:

- The abnormal course condition is on the course (not out of bounds), and
- The ball is anywhere on the course, **except** in a penalty area (where the player's only relief is under rule 17).

(3) No Relief When Clearly Unreasonable to Play Ball

There is no relief under rule 16.1:

- When playing the ball as it lies is clearly unreasonable because of something other than an abnormal course condition (such as when a player is standing in temporary water or on an immovable obstruction but is unable to make a stroke because of where the ball lies in a bush), or
- When interference exists only because the player chooses a club, type of stance or swing or direction of play that is clearly unreasonable under the circumstances.

Examples:



It the first photo it is clear that the player has a clear shot to the hole so there would be no free relief granted in this situation and he must play the ball as it lies. In the second photo the player is attempting to make an unreasonable claim that his swing would be interfered with by the fence.



In this photo the player's ball lies near a rose bush that has a sprinkler head in it, but clearly the player would not be able to advance the ball toward the hole in this circumstance there would be no free relief granted.

2. No Play Zones - #4, #9, #10 & #18

Rule 17.1e - Relief Must Be Taken from Interference by No Play Zone in Penalty Area

In each of these situations, the player must not play the ball as it lies:

(1) When Ball Is in No Play Zone in Penalty Area.

The player must take penalty relief under Rule 17.1d or 17.2

(2) When No Play Zone on Course Interferes with Stance or Swing for Ball in Penalty Area.

If a player's ball is in a penalty area, and is outside a no play zone but a no play zone (whether in an abnormal course condition or in a penalty area) interferes with his or her area of intended swing, the player must either:

- Take penalty relief outside the penalty area under Rule 17.1d or 17.2,

- Take free relief by dropping the original ball or another ball in their relief area (if it exists) in the penalty area (see Rule 14.3):

> Reference Point: The nearest point of complete relief from the no play zone.

> Size of Relief Area Measured from Reference Point: One club length, but with these limits:

> Limits on Location of Relief Area:

- must be in the same penalty area where the ball lies, and


- must not be nearer the hole than the reference point.

But there is no free relief from interference by the no play zone under (2):

- When playing the ball as it lies is clearly unreasonable because of something other than the no play zone (for example, when a player is unable to make a stroke because of where the ball lies in a bush), or

- When interference exists only because the player chooses a club, type of stance or swing, or direction of play that is clearly unreasonable under the circumstances.

Examples:



In these two examples the player in both cases must take penalty relief from the Penalty Area - No Play Zone even though he would have the ability to play the ball. A player must not play from inside a No Play Zone.

Tuesday, April 9, 1996, will be remembered for a long time. When we first started paving the cart paths, it seemed like an endless project. But here we are in 1996 and all is complete. A considerable amount of work on the paths is still ahead of us. We must fill dirt along the edges and seed or place sod for a final appearance. We have fallen behind in that effort. But it will get done!

Doing all this work on cart paths during the past seven or eight years provided some pretty large numbers:

- 1,290 cubic yards of concrete.
- 18,930 lineal feet of paths concreted.
- 103,070 square feet of concrete layed.
- 67-1/2 months to complete.
- \$ 81,270 total cost of concrete.
- \$305,000 estimated savings by volunteer effort.

It was a job well done, even considering the interference we gave to the Women's Club.


