Leroy who was born in 1925 was the youngest player in his foursome at 90 years old. Joining Leroy in his foursome were Jim Magill 93, Bob Clow 92 and Harry Larson 90. They witnessed the event though none of them could see the ball fall in the hole from 140 yards away.





Getting to Know Pat Kemball Director of Golf, Canyon Lake POA.....by Ted Horton

Pat grew up in a small town Northeast of Winnipeg, Manitoba, Canada where hockey was king. He was quite a hockey player as a youngster and advanced within the sport to where he was travelling away from home a great deal as a young man with NHL aspirations. No one in his family played golf but his mother used to love to watch golf on TV and she had encouraged him to get some left handed clubs when he was 11 years old. He was hooked on the sport and spent every possible hour during the next six summers at the Pine Falls Golf Course, mentored by golf professional Jerry Hollins. Before attending college, Pat was working in the local paper mill and Jerry suggested that he consider golf as a profession.



He joined the Canadian PGA and decided to gather experience working

for two years at John Blumberg Golf Course as an Assistant Professional and then moved to neighboring Pine Ridge Golf Club. He continued to excel at golf, winning the 1988 & 1990 Province of Manitoba Assistant PGA Championships and the 1988, 1992, 1994 PGA Provincial Championship. He was named the "Manitoba PGA Player of the Year" <u>five</u> times. He played in a few events on the Canadian Tour, but never "won big". He was soon awarded the Head PGA Professional job at Pine Ridge and remained there for 6 years.

Deciding that he needed a change in his personal life circumstances, Pat decided to pack up the car and head south to Temecula for a winter of California golf instead of hockey. He found employment at the SCGA Golf Course where he met his wife Brenda, then an employee of the SCGA and now Manager of SCGA Member Outings. The next summer, Pat had to return to Pine Ridge Golf Club to complete his contract, but returned the next winter to accept a job as a Teaching Professional/Manager of a golf range in Menifee while resolving immigration issues. A year later he was hired as Head Golf Professional at the SCGA Golf Course and married to Brenda. Fore Magazine celebrated their union with the article *"Canadian Boy Meets Southern California Gal"*. They have been married 20 years now. Four years later, SCGA named Pat General Manager where he served for 6 years until the club was sold in 2010. He responded to an RFP for Director of Golf at Canyon Lake Country Club and the rest is history.

In the US, Pat has continued to gather awards: In 2016, Fore Magazine awarded Pat with the recognition "Best PGA Pro in Southern California". In 2018, he was again recognized as the "SCPGA Inland Empire Teacher of the Year" and in 2006 he was recognized as the Bill Strausbaugh Award Winner from the Inland Empire Southern California PGA.

Recently, Pat returned from a visit to his home course of Pine Falls GC, NE of Winnipeg where the members honored his achievements as a PGA Professional and posted a picture and plaque to his tribute on their trophy wall. But, to Pat's dismay the trees that he used to easily hit over 25 years ago have grown considerably.

Along with his love of the game and the opportunity to teach the sport, Pat enjoys golf course design, gardening and yes a little adult (read old men's) hockey.

John Hardy, PGA Master Professional said it best: "Patrick is one of the most respected Golf Professionals in our profession. He is a role model to those that follow, and one of the nicest human beings. Canyon Lake is extremely fortunate to have him. I am also fortunate to have him as my friend". We agree and are pleased that the POA has renewed his contract for another five years. Eh!

The primary responsibility of the Green Committee is to advise and assist the Board of Directors, in



developing and implementing preservation, enhancement and maintenance of the golf course in cooperation with the Canyon Lake Property Owners Association, hereinafter referred to as the CLPOA. The committee participates in a course inspection once per month with the Golf Course Maintenance Superintendent that results in a written report summarizing the following items:

- Summary of the course condition
- list of potential problems
- Solutions to the problems to be completed now and in the future
- Set a definite time frame when and how problems will be solved

Copies of this report are distributed to the General Manager, the Green Committee, the Golf Course Maintenance Contract Superintendent, and the Contractor's Corporate Office.

Currently, the Green committee is working with the POA on the following projects and issues.

- Restoration of the lakes #13. Hopefully a request for final approval will be presented to the POA Board in August and the work started during the October shutdown.
- Recommendations related to the Golf Course Maintenance Contract now under consideration.
- Recommendations related to repairs for the Parking Lot and golf cart parking area, expected to be done during the October closure.
- Recommendations related to the Golf course irrigation system.
- Continue the surveying of all the trees on the course for future recommendations.
- Cart path widening project adjacent to the #6 green by a third party contractor.



Our Green committee continues to maintain a good working relationship with the Director of operations, Steve Schneider, and the Golf Course maintenance team. They meet every second Thursday of the month. The meeting is open to all Canyon lake POA members. Your suggestions are always welcome.

The days of yore..... Canyon Lake Country Club circa 80's

The article and the photo below appeared in the February 1985 issue of our Golf Bulletin and reported the story of our second annual "Tree Tournament". Read on.....

PLAQUES PRESENTED TO TREE TOURNAMENT SPONSORS

Last years annual "Tree Tourney" was sponsored by Hemet Federal Savings & Loan and the end result was about 80 new trees for the beautification of the Canyon Lake Golf Course.

Shown above are (l to r) Bob Eichinger, President of Hemet Federal, Jim Magill, Carol Carter, Manager of our local branch of Hemet Federal, and Hugh Wagoner. Jim and Hugh are presenting a plaque to Bob and Carol as a special way of saying thanks for Hemet Federal's support of our "Tree Tourney". It is hoped that Hemet Federal will repeat as sponsor in 1985.

The plaques were donated by the Mens , and Womens golf Clubs.



What is now named the "Beautification Tournament" was originally the "Tree Tournament". The purpose of these tournaments was to supply trees to what then was a barren golf course. The date of the second annual "Tree Tournament was October 28, 1984. The entry fee was \$30.00 per couple and with this \$30 donation trees were purchased, and the names of the donor were placed on the tree as they were planted. A total of 75 trees (15 gallons in size) with stakes and other supplies for planting were purchased with the money raised. Following play a barbecue was enjoyed in the Plumbout Room by those who participated. As far as I know there is only one of the 75 trees that still have the name of the donor on it. If you'll look closely to the tree on the east side of the third green you will still see the name, Bob Craig, a retired CHP officer who donated that tree and who at that time was a member of the Men's Golf Club.

A further note...The Plumbout Room derived its name from a time when a patio was added to the existing club room and during the design the "architects" told the members that they were going to extend the existing club room with a patio that will also extend "plumbing out to here".

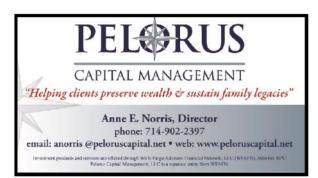
