Call to Order: President Bill Levis.

The meeting was called to order at 2:21 PM followed by the Pledge of Allegiance.

Roll call: Present were President Bill Levis, VP Roger Kielty, Directors Greg Brack, Jon Evans, Ted Horton, Shannon VanDruff, Fred Vian & Chris Wilkeson. Absent was Leroy Nelson & Rod Smith. A quorum was declared.

6 members attended the meeting.

Acceptance of prior minutes: It was moved by Director Evans, seconded by President Levis and accepted "to approve the November 1, 2017 meeting minutes as written".

Treasurer's report: Treasurer Rod Smith absent – No report.

Secretary's Report: Director Horton reported that all correspondence is current and adequate supplies are on hand. Correspondence for November 2017 consisted of:

- Get well cards Jim Paulis broken arm
- Sympathy cards None
- A letter from Canyon Lake Association of Past Presidents "thanking the board for their efforts of the past year" was read.

Director of Golf: Pat Kemball

Absent – no report

Golf Course Superintendent: Mark Louder

Absent – President Levis conveyed Mark's request that golf car traffic, including cars with medical flags, must remain on the golf car paths for the designated time during periods of frost. No exceptions!

Handicap: Chairman Wilkeson reported that during the month of November 2017: 56 handicap indexes went down; 105 handicap indexes remained the same; 111 handicap indexes went up; 8 members have no index established and we have 9 members with local handicaps (Index over 36.4). There were 1,039 rounds posted by 194 members: 9 rounds were not posted (6-day spot check); 4 cards were posted with no, or incomplete names; 3 cards were posted on the wrong day.

• There is not a penalty assessed if posted on the wrong day but wrong day postings are difficult to verify. Posting errors is still a problem.

Options for the Hole-in-One fund were presented for discussion:

- Leave it the way it currently is with a set carry-over of \$200 or 10%, whichever is less.
- 1 time buy-in at approximately \$5.00 per member. The winnings would be restricted to approximately \$675.00
- Contribute each Wednesday but restrict to a capped amount. Perhaps any balance over the cap could be contributed to a designated charity?
- A rules sheet needs to be set up.
- We've had 3 winners over the recent years \$1,600, \$2,200 and lastly \$14,000.
 We were reminded that the CLMGC pays for drinks for members any day that a member of the club makes a hole-in-one.
- It was suggested that the Board keep it simple as they ponder the final set-up of the Hole-in-One program.
- It was commented that a CLMGC past Board determined that the club will fund only golf charities.

Membership and Rules: Chairman Brack noted that there were no rules issues reported in November. There are currently 281 Regular and 2 Junior Members. 81 members enrolled on line (28%). Please obtain a copy of the SCGA Portal link from the proshop. GHIN email reminders will be sent out through the balance of the month. A telephone campaign will be organized toward the deadline for renewal to assure that no member is left behind.

As was suggested last month, membership data in the SCGA database is now managed by the Membership Chair.

- The subcommittee of Directors Brack, Horton, Kielty & Wilkeson "to assist POA staff to manage non-resident golf membership recruitment" had no report.
- A rules seminar to be taught by Judy Thompson, Pat Kemball and staff has been scheduled for January 9th, 2018 at 4:00 PM in the Magnolia Room. It was moved by Director Brack, seconded by Director Vandruff and approved "that the CLMGC contribute \$300.00 to provide of light appetizers". Room setup and appetizer organization will be coordinated by Directors Kielty and Brack. A signup sheet will be posted in the proshop by Director Brack.

Lunch and awards will follow in the clubhouse. There are 32 reservations to date and sign-up opportunities remain open until Friday.

A potential conflict with a celebration of life was discussed. It was noted that in the past use


