LeRoy M Lilly born July 14, 1924 in Long Beach Ca. passed away on January 27th after a prolonged illness. Lee was 93 years old.

Lee served in World War II, graduated from UCLA, worked as a Civil Engineer for the City of Los Angeles and spent 28 years as a Los Angeles Firefighter.

Lee and his wife Cathy moved to Canyon Lake in 1981 where he enjoyed golf and became one of the founding members of the Tuesday Work Group.

Lee was a regular in the After Lunch Bunch for more than 30 years and became President of the Men's Golf Club in 1997. Lee served 20 years on the CLAPPS where he helped raise thousands of dollars for golf course improvements and beautification.

Lee has devoted much of his time and talents to the golf course and the Men's Golf Club over his 36 years in Canyon Lake. He will be sadly missed.

The Canyon Lake Association of Past Presidents (CLAPPS) and wives held their annual installation dinner Feb 1st at the Lodge. Bill Levis, the 2017 Men's Golf Club President. was honored with the presentation of the "White Jacket" and welcomed in to the fraternity of the CLAPPS. The evening had a solemn moment when the group bowed their heads in silence in memory of Lee Lilly who passed away recently. The CLAPPS have a long history of serving the golf community in Canyon Lake in many ways. They advise and mentor the sitting Men's Golf Club Board of Directors, They recruit candidates and oversee the election of officers for the Men's Golf Club, work closely with the Tuesday Work Group on projects and raise funds for improvements on the golf course. The CLAPPS latest project is the installation of a \$12,000 post clock which was raised from proceeds of the Beautification Tournament

New Clock Donated to the Golf Course







The Canyon Lake Association of Past Presidents (CLAPPS) continues their efforts to beautify and improve our golf course. This year they purchased a classic Street Clock manufactured by Electric Time Company in Medfield Ma. They have been building clocks for nearly a century and are considered one of the premier clock builders in the country. The clock model is a "Small Howard Two Dial Replica Street Clock" that stands nearly 11 feet tall (the large version stands over 15 feet tall). This style can be seen at many premier golf courses such as Pinehurst and Pebble Beach as well as centerpieces for many small towns across America.

The clock is solidly built with a cast aluminum body and a polyurethane finish that will last for many years and weighs approximately 280 pounds. It was set on a 3' x 3' concrete foundation with stainless steel anchor bolts. Concrete and underground work was done by the volunteers of the Tuesday Work Group (TWG) who devoted significant man power for the project. Installation of the clock was a joint effort of the TWG and Operations crew .This was all made

possible from funds raised from the annual Beautification Golf Tournament organized by the CLAPPS. About 6 months ago they decided to look at the possibilities of a large clock for the golf course. After extensive research they found this clock and worked closely with Electric Time Co. to stay within their \$12,000 budget. The final

cost with installation was under \$11,000. The CLAPPS Beautification Tournament has a long history of raising funds to improve the golf course. It is estimated they have raised over \$80,000 for improvements in recent years. Some of their recent projects include13 new concrete benches, 20 bronze plaque tee signs, expansion of the practice putting green, installation of the concrete pad and artificial turf on the driving range, new decking on the bridge at hole #13, install decorative rock at the logo area on the hillside of hole #14, build the shed over the ball machine at the driving range, provide yardage markers on the course and a multitude of trees and flowers that beautify our course.

The CLAPPS President, Jim Magill, said we have always worked closely with the TWG for the Installation of our projects. We are very appreciative of their efforts and are grateful for their commitment to our golf course.

Canyon Lake Men's Golf Club Minutes of the Board of Directors February 7, 2018

Call to Order: President Travis Montgomery called the meeting to order at 1:55 p.m. and led the Pledge of Allegiance.

Attendance: Present were President Travis Montgomery, 1st VP Chris Wilkeson, 2nd VP Jon Evans, Directors Greg Brack, Joe Kamashian, Rod Smith and Shannon VanDruff. Absent were Secretary Ted Horton and Directors Gary Bradford and Steve McCain. A quorum was present.

Approval of Minutes: Joe Kamashian stated that the cost of the Bulletin in the minutes was \$140/month not \$100. Without further corrections the minutes of the January 3, 2018 BOD Meeting were unanimously approved as submitted.

Director of Golf Report: Not in attendance

Golf Course Superintendent Report: Not in attendance

SCGA Liaison Report: Dudley Thompson reported that he had nothing new to report.

Secretary's Report: Travis Montgomery read the Secretary's Report indicating that all correspondence is current and all supplies are on hand.

- Get well card sent to Marilyn Nelson (Leroy) who fell and broke her tailbone
- Sympathy card sent to the family of Max Duncan who passed away.

Treasurer's Report: Rod Smith presented the Operating Budget for January and an ending bank balance statement of \$28, 207.43... All income and expenses were in order. Without objection, the Treasurer's Report was accepted.

- All signatures on the bank account have been changed as approved by the Board.
- The audit by Rod Smith, Barry Talbot and Ted Horton is yet to be completed.
- Temecula Valley League (TVL) request: Funding of \$600 for entry in the TVL was requested by the Captain as included in the budget. Without objection the funding was approve.

Handicap Report: Chris Wilkeson reported that during the month of January: 46 indexes went down; 84 remained the same; 121 went up; 10 members had no handicap and nine members had a local index (over36.4). 1,135 rounds were posted by 190 members. 20 rounds not posted, four cards had no date and two cards had incomplete names.

• Director Wilkeson presented, for discussion, a format that would allow all players to participate in <u>all</u> Wednesday games (game, skins, hole-in-one) while playing from different tees that conforms to the current USGA handicap system. After discussion, it was moved by Director Kamashian, seconded by Director Brack that the proposal be presented to the members at the March 7, 2018 Board meeting. The motion passed unanimously.

Major Tournaments: Director Evans reported that all arrangements for the Sweetheart Tournament on February 11 were in place. He asked for volunteers from the Board to assist at check-in prior to the tournament. There are 60 players to date.

- Presidents Cup: There was discussion regarding the two-day kick-off for the President Cup on April 21 and 22. Concern was expressed that reserving the golf course for two days for 64 members of the Men's Golf Club restricted the use of the golf course by other golfers. This is a match play event and the number of players decreases each week. There is ample time to have qualifying matches played on April 22 and elimination matches <u>played by the following Sunday</u> to complete the President and Vice President Cups by May 27. It was moved by Director Kamashian, seconded by Director Evans that the Presidents Cup kick-off be a one-day event on Saturday, April 21. The motion passed unanimously.
- Fall Member/Member Tournament: At the Board meeting on January 3, it was approved "that members must play in at least two of the club's major tournaments in the calendar year prior to the event in order to qualify for entry to the (Fall) Member/Member Tournament. After discussion, it was moved by Director Kamashian, seconded by Director Brack that the matter be placed on the March 7 Board agenda for Reconsideration. The motion passed unanimously.

Wednesday Game: Director Gary Bradford submitted a written report transmitting \$694 to the Hole-in-One fund; \$158 for the Veterans Day fund and \$223 for the Picnic fund.

• The Wednesday Game crew is becoming more accustomed to the task at hand and was assisted during the transition by last year's crew.

Membership & Rules: Director Brack reported that there are 251 members and that 81 renewals were done online. There is one new member during the past month and two Junior members.

• A New Membership Application has been developed as has a "Welcome" document that is given to new members explaining the activities of the Men's Golf Club, including tournaments, Wednesday Golf, how

to establish a handicap, etc.

• Working on a "Rules Seminar" for new members with basic rules, how to correctly mark ball, etiquette, etc.

Public Relations: Director Kamashian reported the Bulletin is now being printed and published by Venus Printing who is also doing the layout for each edition. The first edition, January, looked very good and the online version is well received.

- Bulletin contributors need to send their material to both Venus and Joe Kamashian <u>no later than the 20th</u> of the month.
- There are 15 paid sponsors of the Bulletin.
- The Roster Book material is being gathered and the Standing Rules and tournament formats are being reviewed before publication. Directors were asked to forward any changes or corrections to their respective areas of interest in particular.
- The Club Championship format(s) is being reviewed by the Golf Pro for suggestions.

Green Committee: Director VanDruff reported the clean-up of the area where golf carts park for the #8 tee boxes and the installation of split rail fencing and ground cover in this area is moving forward and is in the hands of POA Operations for implementation with help from the TWG.

- The planting of a new tree, further to the left of the cart path on #14, adjacent to the Green Tee box, and removal of the existing tree that blocks visibility of the cart path in either direction, from the top of the hill or the main tee box was recommended by the Green Committee and POA Operations is going to proceed with the work.
- A recommendation to remove approximately 2/3 of the cart path curb, going up the hill on the right side of #16, just after the drainage crossing, was unanimously approved and a Tracking Form is being submitted to POA Operations for approval and implementation.
- As discussed at the Men's Golf Club Board meeting on January 3, the Green Committee has recommended to POA Operations that "hand railings" adjacent to the commodes in the Country Club and golf course men's restrooms be installed. They already exist in the ladies restrooms.
- Golf Pro Pat Kemball discussed making the drought tolerant area left of the cart path on #4, all the way up the hill and behind the #4 green "**Out of Bounds**". The same designation was discussed for the area behind the #12 green. The matter was tabled for discussion at the next Green Committee meeting.

Social: It was reported that everything was in place for the Sweetheart Tournament. There will be a "taco bar" and table decorations will be in place.

President's Report: President Montgomery reported on several matters involving the Men's Golf Club:

- Budget Workshops for the 2018/19 POA Budget will be held on February 13 and 22 at 6 p.m. at the Lodge. All golf fees, annual, daily, 20 rounds, twilight, etc. will be recommended to the POA Board by the POA Finance Committee at these meetings.
- Recommendations by the four golf clubs (Men's, Women's, Family and 9'ers) Steering Committee were made to the Finance Committee and may or may not be included in the Finance Committee recommendation to the Board. Of particular concern to golfers is the **already adopted** annual fee of \$2,400 effective May 1, 2018. Golf club members are encouraged to attend the Budget Workshops.
- At the POA Board meeting on February 6, 2018 the Board adopted a requirement that all golf cart owners provide proof of golf cart insurance in order to register a golf cart for use on the golf course or streets. Similar to a previous rule that was no longer in effect.
- The POA Board retained a Golf Course Consultant to review the financial performance, physical assets, operations, maintenance, private/public usage, fees, membership levels and improvements to the golf course. The consultant report is due anytime. A follow-up survey of all residents is planned, once the initial report is received. **Golfers will want to make certain they respond.**
- The Family Matters Club requested financial support for the Children's Easter Egg hunt on March 24. It is a budgeted item and the request was approved. The Men's Golf Club was the originator of the Easter Egg Hunt and has turned it over to other clubs in recent years, providing financial support.

COMMITTEE REPORTS

Greens Committee: Linda Johnson - WGC Representative Ms. Johnson reported from the January 12, 2018 meeting 1. Hole 14: The tree on the left side of the cart path will be removed and replaced by a new tree that will be planted further from the cart path.

2. Hole 4: Operations is going to evaluate moving the cart path behind the green further to the back left and sloping grass behind the green.

3. Hole 16: Two thirds of the curb will be removed, up to just short of the top of the hill.

Mark Lauder: Golf Course Superintendent The golf course received 2.1 inches of rain and sustained no significant damage. Spraying will begin on Monday, January 22, 2018 to the fairways to promote growth of recently planted rye grass. Seeding with rve grass continues.

The new tee marker samples have arrived, but the committee felt they were too dark. The Committee is looking at alternatives.

Tom Nathan: POA Liaison The parking lot project is still in the planning stages and is about 50% complete. Work continues with the Water District to approve the use of reclaimed water on holes 3,4,5, and 6. This will save money now spent on potable water.

Operations: Sal Medina New flooring in the men's restroom will be installed this month.

A suggestion was made to install hand rails in the restrooms for safety reasons. This is to be presented to the POA. Bids are still being submitted for the lake renovation. Some work has already begun on this project.

Pat Kemball: Club Professional Revenue is up this year, Suggestions: On #4, a split rail fence could be installed along the drought tolerant and behind the green and marked Out of Bounds.

A spilt rail fence could also be installed behind Hole #12 that would make the drought toilernt area Out of Bounds. These two possible Out of Bounds areas are being evaluated by the Green Committee.

The SCGA sponsored events are listed on the SCGA webpage. www.wscga.org **CLIPPS: Valerie Montgomery** Ms. Montgomery reported that seven members of CLIPPs are in attendance to hear the

discussion concerning the use of Green Tees during CLWGC Tuesday play.

The annual Senior Tournament will be planned at the next CLIPPS meeting.

They are very involved and working hard on the Annual Golf Increase proposal. The Proposal has been sent to both the Finance Committee and the Board of Directors.

It is the position of CLIPPS that the POA Board has acted beyond their purview in increasing the Annual Golf Fee. Items on the Consent Calendar of the POA Board Meeting:

Reinstate the requirement that every golf cart must have a Certificate of insurance filed with the POA.

The POA will come in with a budget surplus this year of approximately one million dollars. The Board is considering using this surplus to return monies to homeowners in the form of a reduction in the POA dues and may place this issue on the May ballot.

Big Sister/Little Sister: Ellie Clow Ms. Clow thanked the participants of the Big Sister/Little Sister Event. Congrtulated the 12 graduates.

18 Hole/Niners Liaison: Barbara Spraul Pat Kemball is offering beginning group golf lessons, four lessons, 1.5 hours @\$75. At the conclusion, Pat is offering a 30 minute golf lesson and the 9er's will be raffling a free membership to the 9er's Golf Club.

Old Business

Use of Green Tees Ms. Furry opened the floor to discuss the use of Green Tees during CLWGC Tuesday Play and Tournaments. Marilyn Bridges explained the adjustments that would take place to facilitate the use of Green Tees. After much discussion it was agreed that any member, regardless of handicap, may choose to play from either the White or Green Tees. If a member chooses to play from the Green Tees she will be placed in the "Green Tee" flight.

A separate Green Tee Hole in One fund will need to be in place as well as "Ringer".

If the competition is mixed tees within the same flight then the SCGA mandated differential will be used.

Handicaps for Flights Ms. Furry opened discussions on the Handicap spread for Flights. It was suggested that no more than a ten stroke difference in any Flight. After much discussion the Flights will be based on the low handicap with a differential of no more than ten. As of today's date the Flights will be: Flight A 14-21, Flight B 22-29, Flight C 30-39, Flight D 40 and above.

Fiesta Days-Soda Sales Ms. Cortez opened discussion on whether the CLWGC wants to continue to sell soda at Fiesta Days. In 2017 the Club sold Pizza in addition to the soda. The profit margin for selling soda is very small. It is very difficult to physically move the product. At the conclusion of discussion it was decided the CLWGC would not sell soda, but would continue to sell Pizza.

Ms. Cortez also notified the membership that any canopy used at Fiesta Days would need to fulfill the requirements stated by the Fire Department.

Ms. Mary Craton reported the storage area is crowded, and suggested we use the decorations we have on hand and stop purchasing new, It was suggested that the storage area be organized and cleaned up.

New Business

Annual Rate Increase Report The Steering Committee consists of fifteen members, each Golf Club being represented. Five members of the Committee met with POA President Paul Queen. Prior to the meeting Mr. Queen was given the Committee's proposal. The Proposal also was given to the Finance Committee. The membership was encouraged to attend the regular POA meeting on Feb. 6, as well as the Budget Workshop Feb. 13.
