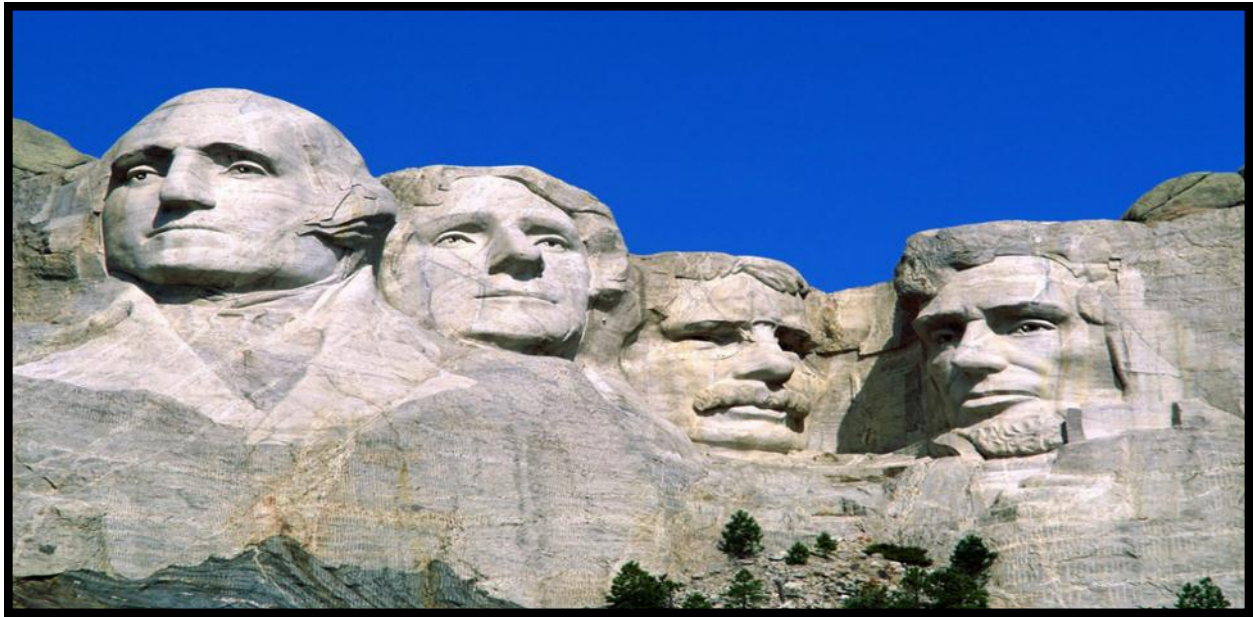

Your attendance, support and comments resulted in a reduction of the adopted annual golf fee for 2018/19 from \$2,400 to \$1,950. It is still more than recommended by the POA Finance Committee and the ad hoc committee representing the four golf clubs. Continue to keep your eyes on POA Board meetings. They will be making decisions throughout the year that may have a financial impact on you as important as the golf fees. It's too bad there are currently no golfers on the Board. Its POA Board election time, so review the candidates carefully so you can make an informed vote.

With one major tournament behind us, it's time for the Presidents and Vice Presidents Cup match play tournament. The tournament is limited to the first 64 members who sign-up. Complete Your Round in 4 1/2 hours

This should be the goal of every foursome. There have been recent rounds taking in excess of five hours to play in the Wednesday Game. The Men's Golf Club has a Wednesday rule that allows disqualification if a round takes more than five hours. It's a rule no one wants to impose, but may be necessary if five hour plus rounds continue. Here are some tips to help play in less time

- Play ready golf when appropriate
- Keep the group in front of you in sight
- If you're a hole behind, pick up your pace before being told
- If you're in close proximity of your ball when your cart partner is hitting, walk to your ball and be ready to hit when it's your turn
- After playing your ball get in the cart and move forward for the next shot, then you can clean your club and put your club cover on without delay
- Limit your practice swings to one swing
- Be ready to putt when it's your turn
- Give your playing partners a friendly reminder to keep moving when needed
- Check your pace of play during your round. 15 minutes per hole is 4 1/2 hours

Let's all see what we can do to speed up the pace of play.

MINUTES

Call to Order: President Travis Montgomery called the meeting to order at 1:40 p.m. and led the Pledge of Allegiance.

Attendance: Present were President Travis Montgomery, 1st VP Chris Wilkeson, 2nd VP Jon Evans, Directors Greg Brack, Gary Bradford, Ted Horton, Joe Kamashian, Steve McCain and Shannon VanDruff. Treasurer Rod Smith was absent. A quorum was present. 5 members attended.

Approval of Minutes: It was moved by Gary Bradford, seconded by Steve McCain and approved *"to accept the February 7, 2018 meeting minutes as submitted"*.

Director of Golf Report: Pat Kemball announced that he is trying to initiate a Tuesday evening 9-hole co-ed partners' league event. The format is a two-person team that will play a four week schedule of 9-holes against other two-person teams. The two-person team entry fee for the four weeks is \$50. For those paying green fees, the fee will be \$19. Also, a Thursday evening for a Women's league is being considered.

Golf Course Superintendent Report: Mark Louder was not in attendance

SCGA Liaison Report: Dudley Thompson reported that he had nothing new to report.

Secretary's Report: Secretary Horton reported that all correspondence is current and all supplies are on hand.

- Get well cards in February - none
- Sympathy cards in February - none

Treasurer's Report: President Montgomery presented Treasurer Rod Smith's report noting that in February there was no income but \$2,347 of expenses reported, resulting in \$23,950 on hand February 28, 2018. It was moved by Director Evans, seconded by Director Bradford and accepted *"to approve the report"*.

The audit by Rod Smith, Barry Talbot and Ted Horton is yet to be completed.

Handicap Report: Vice President Wilkeson reported that during the month of February: 53 indexes went down; 78 remained the same; 111 went up; 8 members had no handicap and 10 members had a local index (over 36.4); 1,010 rounds were posted by 186 members; 22 rounds were not posted; 4 cards were turned in with the wrong date; 3 cards had no date & 2 members had their handicap reduced due to low tournament play.

- VP Wilkeson presented a proposal *"to adopt a fair, equitable system that allows all members to participate in all Wednesday games (game, skins, hole-in-one, etc.) while playing from different tees. It was moved by VP Wilkeson, seconded by Director Evans and approved *"to allow golfers with an index of 28.1 to 39.4 to play from the white tees and be eligible for all games. A golfer with an index of 36.5 and greater plays from the green**

tees and is also eligible for all games.” The policy will go into effect as soon as the computer program can be adjusted to accommodate the change. It was pointed out that the SCGA can be petitioned for special dispensation for various disabilities.

Major Tournaments: Director Evans reported the following:

Sweetheart Tournament - 56 players participated on February 11th.

Spring Kickoff Member/Member best ball – approximately 70 players have signed up for the event on March 17-18th. The event will be a 2-man best ball with optional skins (gross & net – 18 & 36 max handicaps). A para-mutual for Saturday morning may be set up if an operator is available.

Fall Member/Member – After discussion, it was moved by Director Bradford, seconded by Director Brack and approved *“to strike the policy adopted in January that a member must have participated in at least two (2) CLMGC tournaments within the past 12 months to be eligible to play in the Annual Fall Member/Member tournament”*.

CLMGC/Family Club – The Family Golf Club has invited the CLMGC to co-host a joint event. Pat Kemball has been asked to suggest a possible date. Director Evans will explore the opportunity.

Wednesday Game: Director Bradford reported that February contributions to the Hole-in-One fund of \$293; \$65 to the Veterans Day fund and \$264 to the Picnic fund. It was clarified that *“no money from the club goes into the Wednesday game events, except for the year-end member/member event”*.

- Pace of Play - Director VanDruff encouraged a discussion on “slow play”. Several suggestions were offered for consideration:
 - ◇ Offer a drink ticket if you finish the round in 4 hours or less;
 - ◇ CLMGC Board members take turns marshalling;
 - ◇ Approach the Golf staff for suggestions;
 - ◇ Remind players about the 5-hour rule adopted last year;
 - ◇ Email blast to remind members;
 - ◇ Outline and promote “ready-golf protocol”;
 - ◇ Implement penalty for slow play; It was noted that we have never penalized anyone for slow play.

Membership & Rules: Director Brack reported that there are 251 members and that 80 renewals were done online (31.8%). There is one Social member and 2 Junior members. Members are encouraged to renew membership “on-line”.

- Director Brack recommended that the CLMGC assist the Proshop staff to present a “beginners class on golf terminology, etiquette, rules and play opportunities for new and potential new members”. After discussion, it was recommended that Director Brack present a format, potential date and costs anticipated for Board review at the April 4, 2018 meeting.

Public Relations: Director Kamashian reported the following:

- The Bulletin paper will be improved for future issues;
- The Roster will be ready in two weeks;
- Articles are needed for the Bulletin.

Green Committee: Director VanDruff reported that:

- Golf course maintenance staff will spray approximately 21 Olive trees to abort fruiting;
- Divots on tees are filled by BrightView staff three times per week;
- Operations is replacing many of the dead plants in DTA; A plan to spruce up some of the plantings adjacent to tee boxes will be proposed;
- Hole 6 – a dead Eucalyptus and Cottonwood tree are scheduled for removal;
- Hole 8 – split rail fencing and DTA planting at the tee is scheduled to be done soon;
- The Men's restroom floors are scheduled to be tiled and handicap rails have been installed.
- Hole 16 – golf car path curbing is scheduled for removal.

Social Committee: Director McCain noted that the "tostado bar" was popular at the Sweet-heart tournament.

- March 24th Easter Egg Hunt – CLMGC will donate \$250 to the Family Matters Easter Egg Hunt. CLMGC volunteers are requested to assist with the event. President Montgomery will send details to the board at a later date.

- Golf Fees were approved at the recent March 6th, 2018 POA Board meeting;
- Proof of insurance will be required to register your golf car with the POA;

- Dudley Thompson is a candidate for the POA 2018-19 Board of Directors; The POA Clubs are sponsoring "Speak to the Candidates" at the Lodge on April 9th, 2018
- Clubs' Rush Event – CLMGC has been invited by the Family Matters Club to participate in a POA Club promotion day scheduled for April 22nd, 2018 from 2:00 PM – 4:00 PM at Holiday Harbor Park. It was moved by Director Brack, seconded by Director McCain and approved "*that CLMGC participate in the Clubs' Rush Event on April 22nd, 2018 at a cost of \$35 entry fee*".
Director Kamashian will provide an EZ-up.
