# **New Emergency Medical Vehicle for our Course**

The new emergency medical response vehicle has arrived at the golf course, in part, due to generous support from the golf community including; Men's Golf Club, Women's Golf Club, 9er's Golf Club and the CLAPPS. Thanks to Jack Wamsley who spearheaded the project we now have a specially built, customized golf cart that can transport emergency personnel to remote areas of the golf course when there is an emergency medical need. Other donors include the CLAMS, CR&R and AMR. The vehicle will be in service as soon as the pro shop staff is properly trained and coordination with the local fire department is completed. It will be on display after golf on May 2 and Jack Wamsley will be there to describe the vehicle and its capabilities at 1:15 p.m.

# Canyon Lake Men's Golf Club... Average Age..2018

Last year we computed the average age of our Canyon Lake Men's Golf Club. It's interesting to see how our average age has changed over the years. In 2016 the average of our membership was 70.1. Last year it dropped to 63.3 and now in 2018 the average is up to 69.

These surveys not only contain the average ages of the membership but also the number of members in the club for those years gone by. As you can see our Club reached it's maximum membership when in 2004 we reached a total of 463 members.

These figures are accurate to the extent that the information came from our 2018 Men's Golf Roster. The roster contains a list of 251 of our members. Eight of our members were not included in the Roster because they either joined after the Roster's printing deadline or in the case of eight who either chose not to divulge their age or the reported age was unclear. According to the Roster our club membership now stands at 251.

The "honor" of being the eldest member of our club still playing golf once again belongs to Mr. Hub Watson who turned 94 last March 11<sup>th</sup>. He is followed closely by your Club's Historian Jim Magill, Gene Brown, Tom Steinle, and Bill Miller who were all born in 1926. All of these gentlemen are still playing golf two or three times a week.

We determine the average age of our club by the total years of the 243 members, 16,752 and then dividing that by the 243. The results follow:

**Secretary's Report:** Secretary Horton reported that all correspondence is current and all supplies are on hand.

**Treasurer's Report:** Treasurer Rod Smith reported the check register beginning balance in March was \$29,954.54 and ending balance was \$27,127.03. He recorded expenses of \$1,774 and year-to-date expenses of \$15,307. with net revenues of \$167.16 for the Sweet Heart Tournament and \$317.34 for the Spring Kick off Tournament. The year-end audit is scheduled and tax materials will be delivered to Lawrence Lathrop, CPA. President Montgomery will check with Mr. Lathrop regarding the tax filing date for the Club. 
