Call to Order: President Travis Montgomery called the meeting to order at 1:20 p.m. and led the Pledge of Allegiance. 2 members were in attendance

Attendance: Present were President Travis Montgomery, 2nd VP Jon Evans, Directors Greg Brack, Gary Bradford, Ted Horton, Joe Kamashian, Treasurer Rod Smith and Shannon VanDruff. 1st VP Chris Wilkeson and Director Steve McCain were absent. A quorum was present. 2 members attended.

Approval of Minutes: It was moved by Director Bradford, seconded by Director Kamashian and approved "to accept the April 4, 2018 meeting minutes as submitted".

Director of Golf Report: Pat Kemball presented a handout (attached) to aid and support review of CLCC golf club merger possibilities. After considerable discussion (pro & con) it was determined that President Montgomery and Directors Joe Kamashian and Gary Bradford would meet with Family Club and Women's Club representatives for further exploration. Pat will share the proposal with the other clubs, seek a joint meeting and report back to the CLMGC.

Golf Course Superintendent Report: Mark Louder was not in attendance

SCGA Liaison Report: Dudley reminded the CLMGC that it is never too early to seek an additional candidate for the next CL POA Board of Directors election cycle.

Secretary's Report: Secretary Horton reported that all correspondence is current and all supplies are on hand.

Treasurer's Report: Treasurer Rod Smith reported the check register beginning balance in April 2018 was \$27,327.36 and ending balance was \$27,713.88. He recorded expenses of \$570.02 and year-to-date expenses of \$16,027.61. It was moved by Director Brack, seconded by Director Kamashian and approved "to accept the Treasurer's report".

Note: SCGA Liaison Dudley Thompson was requested to request an invoice from the SCGA for CLMGC Membership dues.

Handicap Report: President Montgomery reviewed Vice President Wilkeson's report, noting that during the month of April 2018: 105 indexes went down; 74 remained the same; 65 went up; 7 members have no index; and, 13 members have a local index (over 36.4). 1,135 rounds were posted by 187 members; 21 rounds were not posted; 5 cards were turned in with the wrong date or had no date;

Members are still reporting posting problems on the downstairs computer.

Major Tournaments: Director Evans reported the following:

<u>President's Cup – April 21, 2018</u> – we are down to the final 16 for both brackets. The tournament experienced only 1 minor issue that prevented one group from finishing by Tuesday.

<u>CLMGC Championship Tournament</u> – Signs are up in the Proshop for the CLMGC Championship. The tournament is scheduled for 4 rounds of golf on 3 consecutive days, June 1 -3, 2018.

Director Evans was asked to distribute Club Championship Rules to the membership. City of Canyon Lake Championship Tournament – proposed for October 6, 2018. No report.

Wednesday Game: Director Bradford reported April contributions of \$79 to the Veterans' Day fund and \$235 to the Picnic fund. Play averaged 90 (91, 89, 93 & 85) players per day in April.

Director Bradford reported the following computer & program concerns:

- After consultation with Rick Cunya's Associate, a computer cable was replaced;
- The existing computer is 17 years old and still operating Microsoft XP and will need to be replaced soon;
- We need to upgrade the internet capability in the Magnolia room;
- New Tournament Computer Software is being researched. The existing software is too dependent on Bob Carnagey;
- A new CRT and Thumb drive will have to be purchased.

Membership & Rules: Director Brack reported that there are 250 members and that 84 renewals were done online (33.6%). There is one Social member and 2 Junior members. Members are encouraged to renew membership "on-line". A comparison of the CLMGC Roster and the SCGA CLMGC database will be searched for discrepancies. There were no rules issues in this period.

Public Relations: Director Kamashian reported extra Roster books are available for purchase at \$5 each. His committee spent \$64 to purchase a CLMGC Banner for the Club Rush program. He anticipates a cost of \$34 for repairs to coolers for the Fiesta Day Parade.

Green Committee: Director VanDruff reported that:

- 1. 10 green will be resodded with bentgrass. All golfers should take relief no nearer the hole;
- 2. The planter next to the Blue #8 tee will be upgraded with additional plantings;
- 3. A new pump house to contain the greens potable water system pump is being

- constructed next to the 11th tee;
- 4. The decision by SCGA & Director of Golf Kemball on how to treat the drought tolerant plantings left of the 4th tee is still under consideration (environmentally sensitive plantings or, out-of-bounds);
- 5. The golf car path to the right of #6 green will be widened to allow Canyon Estate homeowners to drive to the Towne Center gate;
- 6. Compacted bunkers will be addressed asap;
- 7. A tree is leaning significantly toward the house right of #2 tee.

Social Committee: Director McCain was absent and President Montgomery presented his report:

The application for May 26, 2018 Fiesta Day has been submitted on line. Candy, balloons and flags will be purchased. Director McCain needs to know how many members are going to ride in the parade.

President's Report: President Montgomery discussed the following:


