Secretary's Report: Ted Horton
Secretary Horton reported that all correspondence is current and all supplies are on hand.

The CLMGC Financial Review (audit for YE 2017) discussion was postponed until Treasurer Rod Smith could be present.

Treasurer's Report: Rod Smith – absent
President Montgomery reported that the 2017 taxes have been filed. President Montgomery briefly reviewed the Treasurer's report noting that the "Ending Balance" on 6-25-2018 was \$24,318.89 with "True Funds" of \$21,748.89 available.
