2019 USGA Rules

Here are just a few rules changes that are scheduled to take effect on January 1, 2019

Ball Moved During Search

Under Rule 7.4, if a player accidentally moves his or her ball while searching for it:

- The player will get no penalty for causing it to move, and
- The ball will always be replaced; if the exact spot is not known, the player will replace the ball on the estimated original spot (including on, under or against any attached natural or man-made objects which the ball had been at rest under or against)

No Penalty for Moving a Ball on the Putting Green

Under Rule 13.1d, there will no longer be a penalty if a player (or opponent) accidentally causes the player's ball to move on the putting green.

The substance of this Rule change has already been implemented as of 1 January 2017 by authorizing Committees to adopt a Local Rule that eliminates the penalty for accidentally moving a ball on the putting green.

Standard for Deciding Why a Ball Moved

Under Rule 9.2, the "known or virtually certain" standard (meaning at least 95% likely) will apply to all questions of fact about why a ball at rest moved:

A player, opponent or outside influence will be found to have caused the ball to move if the player, opponent or outside influence was known or virtually certain to have caused it to move; otherwise it will be assumed that natural forces caused it to move. Play the ball as it lies.

Ball in Motion Accidentally Deflected

Under Rule 11.1, for all accidental deflections, including when the ball hits the player or opponent or their equipment or caddies:

- There will be no penalty and the ball will be played as it lies (with limited exceptions).
- To address any concern that a player might deliberately position equipment to act as a backstop and potentially deflect his or her ball, there will be a penalty if the ball hits equipment that was positioned for that purpose (Rule 11.2a).

New Procedure for Dropping a Ball

How a ball may be dropped is simplified; the only requirement will be that the ball be let go from knee height so that it falls through the air and does not touch any part of the player's body or equipment before it hits the ground.

Time for Search Before a Ball is Lost

Under Rule 18.2, the time for a ball search (before the ball becomes lost) will be reduced from 5 minutes to 3 minutes.

Relief for an Embedded Ball

The current default position in the Rules will be reversed:

- Rule 16.3 will allow relief for a ball embedded anywhere in the "general area" (that is, the area currently known as "through the green"), except when embedded in sand.
- But a Committee may adopt a Local Rule restricting relief to a ball embedded in those parts of the general area cut to fairway height or less.
- In taking relief, the player will drop the original ball or a substituted ball within one club-length of (but not nearer the hole than) the spot right behind where the ball was embedded.

Ball Played from the Putting Green Hits Unattended Flagstick in Hole Under Rule 13.2a(2):

- There will no longer be a penalty if a ball played from the putting green hits a flagstick left in the hole.
- Players will not be required to putt with the flagstick in the hole; rather, they will continue to have the choice to have it removed (which includes having someone attend the flagstick and remove it after the ball is played).

Secretary Horton reported that all correspondence is current and all supplies are on hand.

Treasurer's Report: Rod Smith

Handicap Report: 1st Vice President Chris Wilkeson

Jon indicated he will be downstairs each Wednesday in September to sell the 50/50 boards.

Wednesday Game: Gary Bradford

Director Bradford reported that August contributions were \$90 to the Veterans' Day fund and \$278 to the Picnic fund. The average number of Wednesday players in August was 76.

 Director Bradford reported that the POA is working on WiFi for the Magnolia room but we still have computer program problems. Director of Golf, Pat Kemball is helping to research possible replacement programs. Once a new program is selected we will need to purchase a new computer capable of operating the program.

Membership & Rules: Greg Brack - absent

Director Brack's report presented the following:

There are 255members. 92 renewals were done online (36.07%). There are 3 Junior Members, 1 Social Member and two (2) new members this month.

• Changes in the Rules for 2019 are still in discussion and it was confirmed that the Club will host a rules seminar once the changes are finalized.

Public Relations: Joe Kamashian

Director Kamashian reported that the Bulletin is out and again requested additional articles. Friday Flyer Editor Donna Ritchie has posted several golf articles in this week's Flyer.

Green Committee: Shannon VanDruff

Director VanDruff reported that:

- The course will close on October 6th for overseeding and reopen on October 29th;
- Tree review/replacement will be reviewed by a committee headed by Dudley Thompson;
- The drought tolerant shrubs to the right of the golf car path on Hole 12 will be trimmed;
- The new pump for the potable water irrigation of greens has been received and will be installed soon. The lake between the 12th and 13th holes will then be permitted to dry up. It is recommended that a lake design firm(s) and/or golf course architect(s) be contacted to develop plans for replacement of the lake;
- Widening of the golf car path behind the 18th green to permit parking and through traffic has become a priority;
- Posts and ropes may be used to prevent driving and parking golf cars off the golf car path near the 2nd green;
- The irrigation replacement sub-committee chaired by Joe Kamashian is continuing to examine the
 requirements and costs of updating the Canyon Lake Country Club golf course irrigation system.
 Manufacturers Toro and Rain Bird and their representative distributors presented proposals for committee consideration. The committee, its' Irrigation Design Consultant, Golf Course Superintendent,
 Mark Louder and POA Operations Director, Steve Schneider are considering advantages and disadvantages and will submit their suggested purveyor and directions for POA Board consideration
 some time soon.

Social Committee: Steve McCain

Director McCain reported on the following:

- <u>CLWGC Annual Breast Cancer Tournament</u> President Montgomery shared a thank you letter from the CLWGC for our financial support of their Annual Breast Cancer Tournament.
- <u>9ers'Golf Club Scholarship Fund Tournament</u> It was moved by Director Bradford, seconded by 2nd VP Evans and approved "to donate \$250 to the CL 9ers Golf Club upcoming Scholarship Fund Tournament". Treasurer Rod Smith was asked to include this donation in upcoming budget proposals.
- <u>Thursday & Saturday Team Play</u> CLMGC teams and competitive courses are in place for both leagues.
- <u>Canyon Lake City Golf Championship October 6 & 7, 2018</u> John Keigwin and Joe Kamashian are continuing preparations. Director Kamashian noted that the event will have divisions based on handicap groupings (4-5 handicaps each) for gross scores results.
- 2019 Nominating Committee Report
 — President Montgomery reported that the nominating committee of Gary Bradford, Joe Kamashian & Carlos Ramirez have proposed the following candidates:
- ♦ For President Jon Evans
- ♦ For three (3) 3-year terms of Director (1) Rick Halsey, (2) Chris Poland, (3) Andrew Quinn, (4) Tom Scudieri, & (5) Jerry Watson.
- ♦ There were no nominations from the floor.
- It was moved by Director Smith, seconded by Director McCain and approved that "the above slate of candidates be accepted and that nominations close".
 - President Montgomery will purchase and deliver stamps to Carlos Ramirez. Ballots will be mailed to the membership on September 25th.
- <u>Use of "Half-Pops (half strokes)" for Calculation of Skins in the Wednesday Game</u> The five Wednesday games in August were evaluated using both the current full stroke calculation and the half stroke method. The "half-pops" method means that a natural birdie by a player who does not stroke on a hole, will not be tied by a par from player with a full stroke on that hole. The same would be true for a non-stroking player who gets an eagle. He would not be tied by a player with a stroke who gets a birdie. After analysis by Chuck Newsom it was determined the half-pop game in essence is a tiebreaker. More skins are paid out but at a lesser amount. The half-pop game does not penalize the higher handicap because he maintains his advantage, but a half-pop game rewards good play no matter what the handicap level". In short:
- Nobody loses a skin with "half-pops" but the value of skins is slightly reduced;
- We should be doing everything in our power to encourage the best golf possible and be rewarded for it. With "Half-pops" better play will be rewarded;
- ♦ Unfortunately, our computer program cannot accommodate "half-pops" at this time.

After considerable discussion, it was moved by Director Smith, seconded by Director Kamashian and approved "to adopt a trial "half-pop" policy for scoring all CLMGC events commencing as soon as the computer program can accommodate "half-pops". Following the trial the results will be tabulated and the topic will be reopened for discussion.

Executive Session – at 3:30 PM, attending CLMGC members were excused and the CLMGC Board convened for executive session to discuss potential member discipline.


