Hopefully, our long hot summer is coming to an end and we will be able to enjoy our golf course in its best condition of the summer. The golf course superintendent and his staff have worked diligently to protect the course during the record heat. Thanks to all of our members that are participating in the Member/Guest Paradise Classic this next weekend. It should be a fun event for all and an opportunity to share our fine golf course with others. Stag Day is on September 29. This is a fun event, with an opportunity for both players and non-players to win great raffle drawing prizes. Even if you don't play in the tournament, you can buy one or more of the raffle tickets and attend the evening stag dinner and drawing. Members of the Men's Golf Club board will be selling golf, dinner and drawing tickets. At the August Men's Golf Club board meeting, following a member request, the board agreed to review the possibility of the Wednesday 18 max skins game being calculated using "half pops" or half strokes. The five Wednesday games in August will be evaluated using both the current full stroke calculation and the half stroke method. The "half pops" method means that a natural birdie, by a player who does not stroke on a hole, will not be tied by a par from a player with a full stroke on that hole. The same would be true for a non-stroking player who gets an eagle. He would not be tied by a player with a stroke who gets a birdie. This will be discussed in detail at the September 5 Men's Golf Club board meeting. Please come and share your thoughts as the board considers this matter. In case you want to do a little advance planning for when the golf course is closed for "over seeding" and maintenance, the course closes on Monday October 8 and reopens on Monday October 29. We will undoubtedly be "cart paths only" for at least a week upon reopening.

Just before the course closes, the City Championship for Canyon Lake will be held on October 6&7. This event is being sponsored by the POA and the City of Canyon Lake and is open to anybody who would like to play. It is a gross event with flights based on handicaps. Further information is available in the pro shop.

Chuck Hawley Sets Golf Milestone





Chuck Hawley set a golf milestone that most of us would never consider possible. He shot his age 100 times and he is only 86 years old. It all started 15 years ago when he was playing Eagle Glen golf course in Corona on October 1, 2003. Chuck pulled off a smooth 71 to match his age.

Chuck is a long time Canyon Laker who has been around for many years. He purchased his first piece of property in 1977 and spent many days on the lake with his young family. Chuck has always been an avid golfer and joined the Men's Golf Club in 1987.

Over the past 15 years he has played many courses in the area and shot his age at most of them like Diamond Valley, Menifee and Trilogy (Glen Ivy).

One of his more memorable rounds was on a trip to Oak Harbor Washington to visit his brother, a retired Naval Captain. They played "The Gallery" golf course on the Whidbey Island Naval Air Station where Chuck proceeded to shoot his age and beat his brother.

His 100th time came just last month at home in Canyon Lake. On July 20th Chuck shot an 84. That was two below his age which is a fitting way to reach that milestone. That experience was shared by two of his long time friends and golfing buddies for many years Tom Steinle and Larry Gann

Sam Theodora Celebrates His 80th Birthday On the Mound at Angel Stadium





Sam Theodora celebrated his 80th birthday a little early when he walked on the pitching mound at Angel Stadium. He was selected to throw out the first pitch of the game on August 7th when the Angel hosted the Detroit Tigers. Sam won't actually turn 80 until October 9th of this year but that didn't matter because his wife, Joyce, and close family were on hand to celebrate the event.

Sam heard about a campaign the Angels have to recruit fans for the first pitch honors from his son, Todd, whose firm is legal counsel for the Angels. When Sam looked into it he found out the Angels have a program where they honor citizens of the Los Angeles area who have served their country and their community. He immediately filled out the application listing his credentials of military service and many years on the Los Angeles Police Department not knowing what to expect.

Sam served three years in the Coast Guard right after high school then got a job with the US Army where he worked on a Nike/Hercules missile base in New Jersey for four and a half years.

Following his time working for the government Sam joined the Paterson Police Department in New Jersey where he fell in love with police work learned his craft. After five years in Paterson Sam got the bug to move to LA and serve on the LAPD. He went through the full application process, trained at the Police Academy and graduated as a Los Angeles Police Officer where he served 25 years on the department.

Sam's career spanned 38 years where he served his Country and his Community which was what earned him a spot on the pitcher's mound in Angels Stadium where 30,000 fans could thank him for his service.

Sam had several weeks to practice and needed every bit of it. The mound is over 60 feet from home plate and the strike zone is very small. When asked if he wanted to throw from a shorter distance his reply was "you don't know me very well". Sam was committed to throw from the pitcher's mound even if it flew over the catchers head.

On that special night Sam heard his name called out by the public address announcer and proudly walked out of the dugout to the mound. As he stood on the mound he couldn't help but see himself on the giant stadium screen. With all that excitement and everyone watching Sam threw a perfect strike over home plate to Justin Anderson and the celebration began.

Approval of Minutes: It was moved by Director Evans, seconded by Director McCain and approved "to accept the July 11, 2018 meeting minutes as submitted".

Director of Golf Report: Pat Kemball – No report

President Montgomery recognized Pat for being recently honored at his home club in Winnipeg, Manitoba, Canada with his photo on the club's memorial wall. We were amused by his reporting that the trees that he used to easily hit over have grown considerably in 30 years.

Golf Course Superintendent Report: Mark Louder - Absent

SCGA Liaison Report: Dudley Thompson - Absent

Secretary's Report: Ted Horton

Secretary Horton reported that all correspondence is current and all supplies are on hand.

The CLMGC Financial Review (audit for YE 2017) discussion was again postponed until Treasurer Rod Smith could be present.

Treasurer's Report: Rod Smith – absent

The treasurer's report indicates a July 2018 Check Register ending balance of \$25,590.18. The 2018 Tournament Revenues and Expenses were reviewed.

Handicap Report: 1st Vice President Chris Wilkeson

1st Vice President Wilkeson reported that during the month of July 2018: 106 indexes went down; 88 remained the same; 54 went up; 4 members have no index; and, 11 members have a local index (over 36.4). 959 rounds were posted by 179 members; 18 rounds were not posted; 15 cards were turned in with the wrong date or had no date. 1st VP Wilkeson expressed frustration that 3 to 4 cards are posted every day with the wrong date. "It just requires too much time for the Handicap Chairman to review the information". Reminder – "Use the GHIN/SCGA Posting App on your smart phone".

The following items were discussed:

- <u>Guests without GHIN handicap</u> After discussion it was moved by Director Kamashian, seconded by Director McCain and approved that "the Handicap Chairman is authorized to determine an appropriate handicap for members or guests desiring to participate in club events if they do not possess a SCGA GHIN number".
- Access to SCGA CLMGC account It was suggested that the Handicap Chairman and Membership Chairman should both have the access password to the GHIN account.
- <u>"Half-pops"</u> It was suggested that "half-pops" (half strokes) be used for determining "skins for the Wednesday game for 18 and under skins. This would reward natural birdies or natural eagles. After discussion, it was suggested that we run parallel results for Wednesday Games during August to determine what difference "half-pops" would have made prior to further discussion. Members should be alerted that the Board will be determining whether to implement or, not implement "half-pops" for Wednesday Games at its next Board meeting.
- Skins & hole-in-One eligibility from Green Tees the policy has been positively received and one skin has been won from the green tees.

Major Tournaments: 2nd VP Jon Evans

2nd VP Jon Evans reported that:

<u>2018 Member Guest (Paradise Classic)</u> – scheduled for September 7-8, 2018. Price is set at \$100 plus green fee & golf car. Courtesy refreshments will be at holes 5 & 14. There will an optional Friday night Horse Race costing \$5 per player & \$5 green fee for non-annual members

<u>Stag Day</u> – September 29, 2018. 360 raffle tickets have been ordered. Tom Fuhrman will manage the Poker Tournament. It was suggested that we approach other golf courses for a complimentary twosome tee time donation that could be given in lieu of ticket payoff. Golf Pro Pat Kemball offered to do this. It was noted that Stag Day pays off +/- 32 tickets.

Wednesday Game: Gary Bradford - absent

Director Bradford's written report noted July contributions of \$64 to the Veterans' Day fund and \$155 to the Picnic fund.

• Director Bradford urged that we obtain Wi-Fi in the Magnolia Room "to enable use of the SCGA Tournament Software (TMC)". President Montgomery will talk to the POA.

Membership & Rules: Greg Brack

Director Brack presented the following:

There are 253members. 90 renewals were done online (35.7%). There are 3 Junior Members and 1 Social Member. There were no rules issues in July.

- SCGA should be sending out notice for membership renewal two months in advance.
- It was suggested that the club present a "Rules Roundup" later in the year to review the upcoming 2019 revisions.


