Add 12 to the player's Handicap Index at the start date. This value is A. Add 12 to the player's Handicap Index at the end date. This value is B.

Divide value A by value B, calculating to three decimal places. This is the improvement factor. The player with the highest improvement factor should receive the most improved player award.

Example

Starting Handicap Index: 24.3 | Ending Handicap Index: 16.2 Value A: 24.3 + 12 = 36.3 | Value B: 16.2 + 12 = 28.2

A / B: 36.3 / 28.2 = 1.128 Improvement factor: 1.128

2024 UPDATES TO THE WORLD HANDICAP SYSTEM

he World Handicap System[™] (WHS™) is being updated effective January 2024. There are four key changes being implemented:

Reduced Minimum Course Length for Score-Posting Purposes

There will be an updated low-end limit for courses to be issued a Course Rating™ and Slope Rating™ of 1,500 yards for 18 holes or 750 yards for nine holes. This is a reduction from the current minimums of 3,000 yards for 18 holes and 1,500 yards for nine holes. Southern California has the largest segment of courses in the country in this yardage category, approximately 65, which will become eligible for score posting for handicap purposes. The ratings will be provided to these facilities and become available on GHIN. com and the GHIN Mobile App in early January.

Treatment of Nine-Hole Scores

When a player posts a ninehole score, the WHS will automatically calculate an 18-hole Score Differential™ for the round, based on the player's nine-hole Score Differential and their current Handicap Index®, allowing the nine-hole round to be considered in the player's Handicap Index calculation right away.

The Score Differential will be a combination of the nine holes played along with an expected score based on the player's Handicap Index. It is important to note that the expected score is based on the average Score Differential of a player with a given Handicap Index and a normal distribution of scores — so it is not specific to each player. The expected score is not course specific and not related to the nineholes played. As an example, it is not the "back nine" of a course if the nine-hole score played was the front nine. Note 1: If fewer than nine holes are played, the score is not acceptable for handicap purposes.

Note 2: Play of a rated nine is required for a score to be acceptable for handicap purposes.

The above is significantly different than what has happened historically when a player has posted a nine-hole score. An 18-hole Score Differential has been created by combining two nine-hole Score Differentials. This resulted in a nine-hole score waiting to be combined, sometimes for a significant time until another nine-hole score has been posted. The

new procedure will be far more responsive and equitable.

10-17 Hole Scores

Rounds of 10 to 17 holes receive an 18-hole Score Differential with an expected score value for holes not played. When 10-17 holes have been played, a value is calculated from the holes played (must include a rated nine). Then, the expected score procedure is used for any holes not played. Lastly, these values are added to determine the 18-hole Score Differential.

Note: The player will be required to post their score hole by hole when 10-17 holes are played, so the appropriate Score Differential can be calculated from the holes that were played to combine with the expected score for the holes not played. Scoreposting tools will provide this capability.

The new procedure differs from what is in place today. Currently, when 10 to 13 holes are played, scores made on holes 10 through 13 are disregarded and a nine-hole score is posted. When 14-17 holes are played, net par is used for the remaining holes to allow an 18-hole score to be posted. The new procedure generally eliminates the use of net par for holes not played.

Handicap Review

Handicap Review is an integral part of WHS, with such a review recommended at least annually for members of a club. Handicap administration software will include additional reports. analyses and notifications to identify players with abnormal scores and provide recommended actions for the Handicap Committee to consider. In certain scenarios, this will include a recommended amount of adjustment to the Handicap Index. This enhancement does not preclude a Handicap Committee from acting in relation to the Handicap Index for other reasons.

CLAPPS Invitational Golf Tournament – Henderson, NV



The Canyon Lake Association of Past Presidents (**CLAPPS**) hosted an invitational golf tournament in Henderson, NV October 17 and 18 at The Revere Golf Club. 36 Canyon Lake golfers and two guests (26 men and 12 women) played two rounds of golf at Revere, one round on each of their two courses, with the weather in the pleasant upper 80"s. For many years, the **CLAPPS** held a golf getaway and invited the **CLIPPS** (Women's golf club past presidents) to join them. Last year several non CLAPPS and CLIPPS were invited to join the group in an October tournament in Henderson. This year, the **CLAPPS** opened the tournament to all members of the Canyon Lake golf clubs. It was the CLAPPS intention to hold an annual fall tournament held in the greater Las Vegas area, as was done for many years during course closure. That event would attract 80-100 players.

The tournament this year was an individual Stableford format with two flights for the men and two flights for the women and a skins game by flights. The golf course was pretty challenging and on **Day One** Todd Wines garnered **32** points (1-point net bogey, 2-points net par, etc.) to lead Men's A Flight and Terry Voss with **34** points led B Flight. These seem like pretty good scores until you add in the women's flights. With **35** points, Gerry Meeks in Women's A Flight surpassed the men. But wait, with **36** points in women's B flight, Paula Hirsch led the entire field of players. Only the highest points in each flight were awarded prizes on Day One.

On **Day Two**, the leaders in all four flights on Day One were able to maintain their respective leads. The Day One and Day Two scores were combined to determine the overall winners down through six places for the men and four places for the women. On Day Two the overall winners switched, with Terry Voss leading the field with 71 combined points, followed by Todd Wines, Gerry Meeks and Paula Hirsch. Those winning prizes overall for all flights and their points were: Women's A Flight – Gerry Meeks 62 pts; Donna Nunes 60 pts; Kathy Voss 51 pts and Alice Giambra 47 pts. In Women's B Flight – Paula Hirsch 59 pts; Claudia Pinto 57 pts; Emma Magill 46 pts and Maxine Whalen 37 pts. In Men's A Flight – Todd Wines 66 pts; Shannon VanDruff 64 pts; John Giambra 62 pts; Steve McCain 61 pts; John Reed 59 pts and Jon Evans 58 pts. In Men's B Flight – Terry Voss 71 pts; Tom Hirsch 68 pts; Bob Neberman 66 pts; Vern Kelch 59 pts; Mike Pinto 57 pts and Bob Jacobson 52 pts.

Prizes for the Stableford tournament and skins were presented at a sumptuous buffet dinner at the South Point Hotel, where a majority of those in attendance stayed at really reasonable rates. All in all, 27 of those playing came away with either a Stableford or skins prize, that's about two-thirds of the field.

Thanks go to the **CLAPPS** for hosting the event, led by Gary Bradford and assisted by Joe Kamashian, John Reed, Jon Evans, Barry Talbot and Travis Montgomery. And special thanks to Mike Pinto who did the computer scoring for the tournament.

Why is the 14-club rule in effect?

For the better part of a century, players carried an array of hickory-shafted clubs in their bags.

That began to change when the steel shaft was universally approved for use in 1929. Not sure of the effectiveness of steel shafted equipment performance, some competitors incorporated both hickory and steel clubs into their bags to the groans of caddies!

Lawson Little was perhaps the most infamous offender (the winner of the 1934 and 1935 U.S. and British Amateurs). He often carried 30 clubs in his bag during tournaments. During a survey at the 1935 U.S. Open showed the average number of clubs in a player's bag was 18.

In 1936 the USGA and R&A adopted the 14-club limit with it going into effect in 1938.

Why 14? No one really knows, although it has been surmised that most common set makeup at the time was four woods, nine irons and a putter.

Wet Bunkers:


Drains in the bunkers have become clogged and the water from rain and irrigation drain slowly creating puddles and wet sand. The sand becomes quickly contaminated. If the bunker drains slowly, the water is bringing fines to the surface of the sand making the material more dense as water struggles to get through. Also, the sand breaks down because of foot traffic, raking and general bunker maintenance and causes a very fine silt. Overspray from irrigation mixes with the silt and creates a hardening effect. Additionally, dirt from the bunker floor becomes mixed with the sand along with golf course debris that blows into the bunker. When a bunker gets washed out it also brings foreign dirt into the bunker. Contaminated sand clogs bunker drains even more. This Winter's extreme rainy weather is also a contributing factor to the contamination. According to several golf associations (like the USGA Green Section), the life cycle of a bunker is 5-7 years. Currently our bunkers are approaching 8 years old since they were last re-worked, so it's not surprising we are experiencing drainage problems. However, the warmer summer weather should help dry the bunkers out in the coming weeks.

Other notes:

Please ride two to a cart to decrease the amount of carts out there that cause compaction of our turf and please keep carts away from the greens and collars!
